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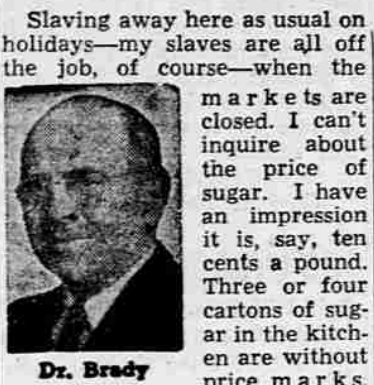

THE PRICE OF SUGAR

Slaving away here as usual on holidays—my slaves are all off the job, of course—when the markets are closed. I can't inquire about the price of sugar. I have an impression it is, say, ten cents a pound. Three or four cartons of sugar in the kitchen are without price marks.

What has the price of sugar to do with health? Don't ask foolish questions. Just keep your mouth shut and listen. Babies thrive best in the first year or so on one kind of sugar, namely, lactose, milk sugar, the kind naturally present in milk. As they grow older babies need and can profitably use both lactose, which they get in milk, and cane sugar or beet sugar, which ever may be more available or cheaper (cane and beet sugar are identical so far as nutrition and health are concerned).

Now here is a statement which no medical or nutrition authority can successfully controvert: Lactose (milk sugar) and sucrose (cane or beet sugar) can do everything for infant or growing child that any other kind of sugar can do.

If a trick baby specialist insists that you feed the baby some kind of trick sugar that costs five or six times the price of ordinary sugar, this is a free counting and you have the right to consider your money as you wish.

There is a peculiar, popular notion that foods or food accessories (such as vitamins) sold in a drugstore are in some vague way superior to foods sold in a grocery or market. People who harbor this notion more readily shell out fantastic prices for sugar for the baby. It makes nice business if you can get it—and as long as there are so many \$400 snobs in Yankee land you can get the business, all right. Snobbery is not the only reason why so many young parents employ specialists instead of

ordinary doctors to care for their babies. Ignorance of the care and feeding of infants, thanks to their poor education, makes young parents feel that the services of the glorified baby sitter, at \$25 to \$50 a month, are necessary.

Employment in State Increases

Salem —(U.P.)—Settlement of most labor disputes and a steady pickup in seasonal activities helped employment recovery throughout Oregon this month, the State Unemployment Commission said Friday.

But the job total continued slightly behind last year's record high.

In mid-May 439,700 persons were in non-farm activities compared with 445,700 the month before and 455,600 in May, 1951. June reports are not expected to reach last year's 468,700 but the return of some 16,000 workers involved in labor-management differences and new calls for farm, food processing and other seasonal help probably will restore 1952 totals close to earlier trends.

Cost of Going to Poorhouse Goes Up

Philadelphian —(U.P.)—Even the cost of going to the poorhouse is going up.

The board of trustees of the Home for the Indigent announced recently that, effective July 26, all residents who can pay anything at all for their keep will be charged \$51 instead of \$41 a month.

The reason: Increased costs of maintenance.

When the council resumes debate on July 1, British delegate Sir Gladwyn Jebb will be sitting in the president's chair. Jebb will preside throughout July.

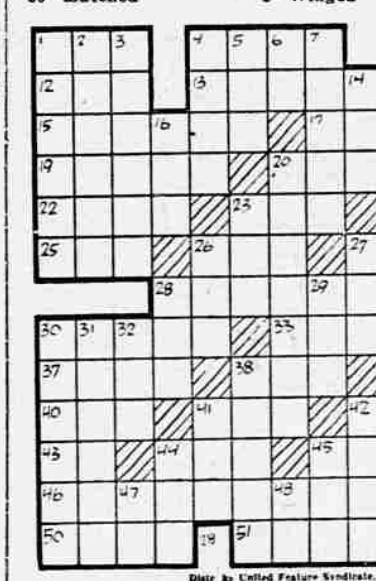

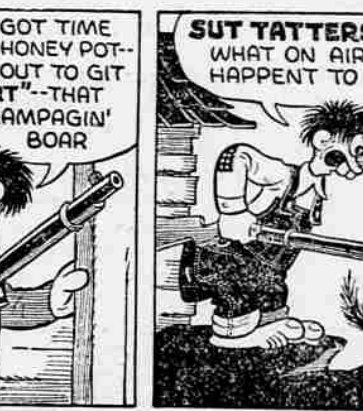
