

Harry Bridges Willing To Submit Ship Dispute To Arbitration Board

San Francisco — (U.P.) — Longshore Leader Harry Bridges says he is willing to submit to an arbitration board the ship gear loading dispute which Bridges charged is the real issue in the month-old AFL sailors strike against Coast trans-ocean shipping.

Film Star Vexed By Stories Given By Her Attorney

Rome, Italy — (U.P.) — Film Star Ingrid Bergman had some advice for her Hollywood attorney, Gregson Bautzer, Saturday:

"Don't give so many interviews."

She denied Bautzer's statement that she had called him by overseas telephone to inform him she would visit the United States in about four or five weeks to personally enter the custody dispute over her daughter, Pia.

A Hollywood court recently upheld her former husband, Dr. Peter Lindstrom, in his objections to a visit by the 13-year-old child to Ingrid and her present husband, Italian Movie Director Roberto Rossellini.

"It's Not True"

Bautzer told Hollywood reporters that Miss Bergman had told him she would come to the United States as soon as she is able, "probably in about four or five weeks."

"It's not true," the ginger-haired screen star snapped.

"I have not talked to Bautzer. I wish he would not give so many interviews."

Miss Bergman, in an interview in the hospital where she is recuperating after the birth of twins, said earlier this week that she would go to the United States "if necessary" to carry on her fight to have her daughter with her six weeks out of each year.

British Radio Bans Home-Ground Talent In Nude on TV Show

London — (U.P.) — The British Broadcasting Corporation has decided that while it will televise nude French showgirls late at night, the home grown variety must hide their charms when they appear on an early evening show.

It ordered 10 nude showgirls in an English burlesque show called "Excitement" at the London Casino to don panties and brassieres for a television performance next month.

"No doubt children will be watching," a BBC spokesman explained.

However, BBC will televise nude French showgirls in a "Follies program from Paris next week without any such restrictions. It will be on the air at a late hour and all children should be in bed by then, the spokesman explained.

Bridges Cites Records

Offering to submit the matter to a panel named by the Federal Conciliation Service, Bridges said, "We have extensive records to show who in the past has done the work."

Harry Lundberg, secretary of the AFL Sailors Union of Pacific, said Friday there was no dispute between his union and the shipowners over the "scope of work" but that the owners were trying to "promote a jurisdictional strike."

The sailors are striking for a five cent pay boost and overtime pay for Saturday work at sea, Lundberg contended.

"Hiding Behind Contract"

The Pacific Maritime association's contract with the I.L.W.U. and its expired contract with the S.U.P. allowed for an overlapping of work between the two unions in the gear stowing. Lundberg was "hiding behind the language of a contract which the employers admit they permitted by mistake," Bridges said.

After a fruitless negotiation session with the shipowners and a federal conciliator, Lundberg ordered his union to tighten its strike by making no exceptions to its "military only" policy.

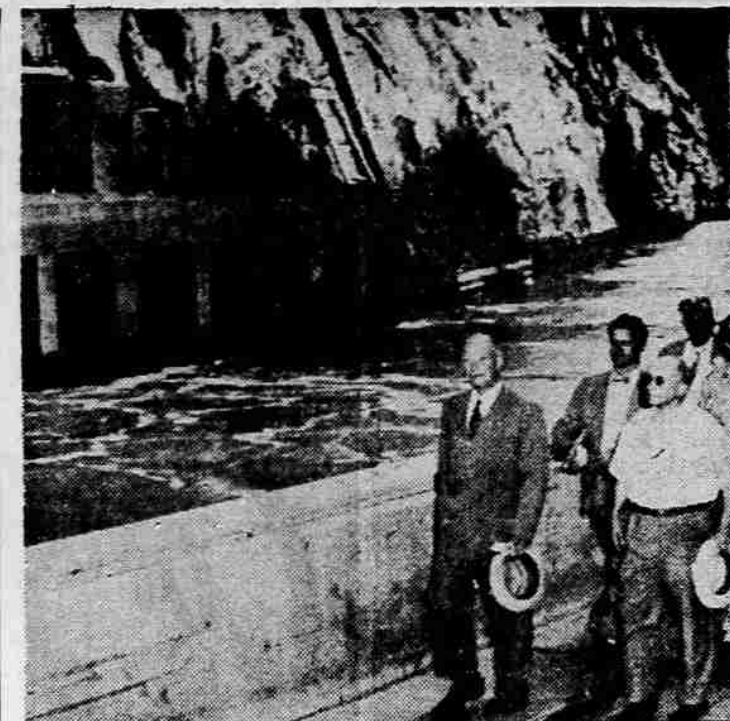

California Worker Shoots Ranchman

Courtland, Calif. — (U.P.) — A 47-year-old Negro late Saturday shot and killed a fellow ranch worker whom he believed was poisoning him, Sheriff's Captain Ray Lagomarsino said.

Wilmer David Marionaux was booked in Sacramento county jail on charges of murder. He admitted he emptied a six-shot .32 caliber Colt pistol into the body of William B. Hicks, 62, also a Negro, at point-blank range.

"Anyone who would poison a man's food deserves to die," Marionaux told Lagomarsino. Marionaux claimed Hicks had been poisoning his food at the Runyan and Dorsey fruit ranch for the past three months.

Lagomarsino said the sheriff's office had found no evidence of the alleged poisoning.

A ranch spokesman told arriving sheriff's officer to "be careful" because Marionaux was "peculiar," Lagomarsino said.

Lagomarsino said Marionaux summoned police through another ranch worker and surrendered quietly.
