Bowman Chucks No-Hitter For Oakland Over Twinks

San Francisco—(U.P.)—Jubilant Roger Bowman, another example of the New York Giant's lend-lease to Oakland, felt like anything but an optioned orphan Friday.

The unbeaten 24-year-old port-side pitcher a no-hit no-run game for the A's Thursday night, notching his second take of the season by a 5-0 count. Bowman beat Hollywood, the league's leading team in both standings and averages.

His trick was the first nine-inning no-hitter on the coast since Warren Hacker of Los Angeles dumbofounded Seattle September 5 last year.

Three Walks

Bowman didn't let a Star sniff first base until the sixth inning, when he walked Dick Wilson. Wilson was immediately wiped out on a double play. In the eighth, Jack Phillips drew a base on balls but he stayed perched on first.

And in the ninth, Bowman gave up his third and last walk to pinch-hitter Jim Mangan. Mangan also died on first. No Hollywood player got beyond that bag. Five of them went down on third-strike pitches.

Bowman, with the Giants early in the season, came to the Oaks last month from Minneapolis. Along with George Bamberger, who pitched a four-hit shutout Wednesday night, Bowman was deposited with the Oaks in the deal that sent Hal Gregg, who pitched a seven-inning no-hitter for Oakland this season to the Giants. Bamberger came outright; Bowman on option.

Tiffs Today Could Jam Loop Races

There will be a lot popping in the old pop-fly palaces besides firecrackers Friday and when the shooting is over both big league races could be jammed up tighter than the holiday highway traffic late tonight.

The jaunty Giants, victors in their last six games with the league-leading Dodgers, could put the National league race into a smack-dab tie by winning both of their games with Brooklyn in the Polo Grounds.

The White Sox, Indians, Senators and Red Sox, all lurking close behind the leading Yankees, will be battling to move up in a big five-way scramble in the American league. The Yankees play twice at Washington, and the other three teams play punching bag opponents, the White Sox meeting the Browns, the Red Sox the Athletics, and the Indians the Tigers.

Premature

The Giants touched off the holiday prematurely Thursday in Brooklyn by topping the Dodgers, 4 to 3, to give Jim Hearn his ninth win against two losses.

In other National league games the Phils made it six wins in their last eight games by blanking the Braves, 2 to 0; the Reds topped the Pirates, 5 to 1, and the Cards won their fourth in a row, 4 to 1 from Chicago.

The White Sox picked up two wins, winding up a suspended game of April 27 with a 6 to 3 decision over the Browns, then moving into second place with a 12 to 3 regulation victory.

The Yankees' lead was cut to 2 1/2 games when the Senators edged them 6 to 4 after losing the opener, 9 to 6. The Athletics edged the Red Sox, 4 to 3, and Cleveland at Detroit was rained out.

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
