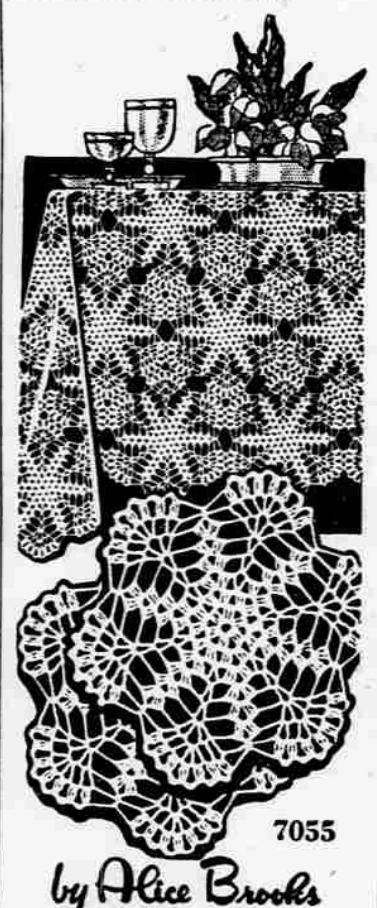
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Former Missionary To Speak in Phoenix; Ladies Aid To Meet

"It'll cost about \$3,000, I figure," Edwards shrugs.

The furrier has been stitching sables for glamour girls for 20 years. In recent years the luminaries have stuck to just plain coats.

Mother-Daughter Outfit

But now he's even making two \$12,000 ranch mink coats, lined with 24-karat gold sequins and glittering with diamond clips on the sleeves. These coats will make a homey mother-and-

daughter outfit for Debbie Reynolds and child actress Noreen Corcoran to wear in MGM "I Love Melvin."

"These are the first unusual things I've done in years," beamed Edwards. "I rent all the furs for MGM movies, and nowadays they have to watch every penny they spend on pictures, with TV here."

One past glory from his Beverly Hills fur shop is an evening skirt made entirely of ermine tails for a beauty to wear in "The Ziegfeld Follies." He also fashioned an evening dress of white fox that Joan Crawford wore in "The Ice Follies of 1939."

Hand-Me-Down Cape

He whipped up a \$35,000 chin-chilla cape for Joan for another movie. That's the only fur piece MGM still owns. It's a hand-me-

down that circulates from movie to movie.

He made an ermine coat for Lana Turner's girl when the moppet was three. Lana got her first fur piece, a silver fox muff and hat to match, from Edwards, too.

Since then he has sold Miss Turner a sable stole, a stone marten stole, two beaver coats, a silver fox stole, a blue fox stole, a Russian sable coat and a couple mink coats he can't remember exactly how many.

"Recently Lana order a vest made out of white ermine," the furrier says. "Looks like the days of wonderful clothes in fur are coming back."

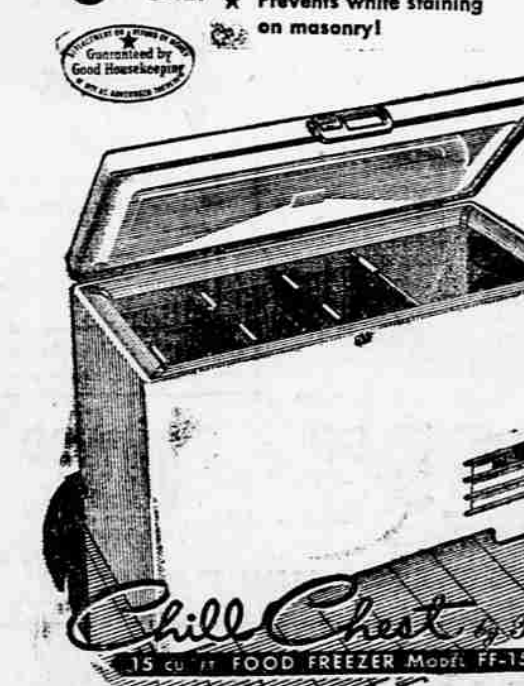
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
