

Victorious Georgia Group Has Trouble Entering Hall

Chicago (U.P.)—When the pro-Eisenhower Republicans from Georgia finally won their fight for seats at the national convention, they were held up at the entrance of Convention hall because they didn't have badges or credentials.

The newly-accredited delegates finally argued their way through the entrance. One of the group was asked how he got by the well-disciplined guards. He quipped: "It was easy. We know a Southern Democrat who has influence."

A page boy hustled through the aisles of packed Convention hall wearing a Kefauver "coon

skin cap. But it had a Taft button on it.

Trigger-happy delegates let out a burst of applause during Wednesday night's session of the GOP convention when a television technician mounted the rostrum to check his light meter.

The Pennsylvania delegation had one of the fastest political caucuses on record during the hearing of Georgia's contested delegates dispute.

When the delegation returned to the convention floor one of the group asked his team mates:

"Say, how are we voting any-how?"

The movie queens and profiles who used to scream at the scripts were patted on the head and given a choice of others. But in these television times, the studios just suspend any complainers and economize by yanking them temporarily off the payroll.

Stars Suspended

Shelley Winters, Rita Hayworth, Dean Martin, Jerry Lewis, Fernando Lamas, Betty Grable, Tyrone Power, Ava Gardner and Tony Curtis are either on suspension or just got off at their studios.

New Richard Widmark is the latest contract star to be minus his paycheck.

"I turned down a weak part in 'The Number,'" he explained. "It just wasn't for me. I don't blame the studio for wanting to keep me working. But if it's a role that would hurt me, then I have to look out for myself."

These days a bum role can slow down an actor, he went on. "I just didn't want to take the risk," the jobless actor said.

"Not at this stage of the game. I've been in Hollywood at 20th Century-Fox studio for five years. It's not so bad to take so-

so parts the past two or three years.

"It doesn't make a helluva lot of difference. Just a Stop Gap."

"But this picture would have been just another stop gap for me. I'd just be around. I need a good picture," he said firmly. "The last role I really liked was 'Panic in the Streets'—and that was two years ago."

"I don't mind if it's another gangster role," he added. "I'll kick the old lady down the stairs again—anything, just so it's a good part."

In the lush pre-TV days, he said, a studio would talk things over with a star who was unhappy with the plots.

"But now if you object, boom! Go on home," he sighed. "It's just a matter of business. They're not so lenient any more."

Tony Curtis was suspended because he tripped off on an unauthorized trip with wife Janet Leigh. Furthermore, the studio added sternly, he once ran up an astronomical phone bill calling her from New York, and then added this fat item to his expense account.

Betty Grable played the horses during her year-long suspension.

Martin and Lewis lolled in Palm Springs. Widmark said he guessed he'd stay home and paint the barn.

He is survived by his widow and one son, Harry R. Minto of Salem.

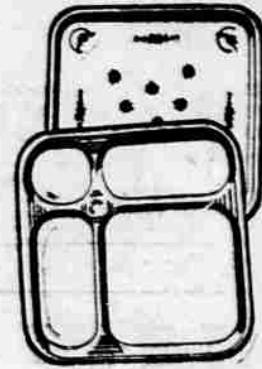
