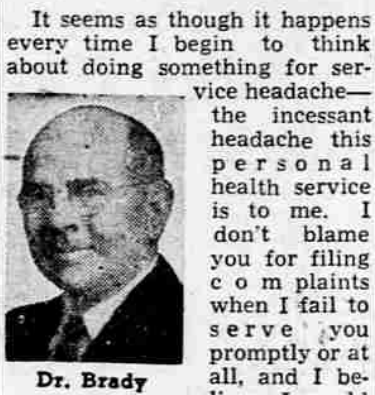

Fat and Diabetes

Answer—Probably the diabetic misunderstood what the doctor said. Sugar is not harmful, but one with diabetes can take only a limited quantity of sugar or starch in any form. Many physicians now believe diabetic persons do better on a high fat diet.

Bunion Can't Be Dissolved

Disappointed when I received your booklet on care of the feet because you give no recipe for dissolving bunion. You said in your paper that bunion can be dissolved. (T. J.)

Answer—I did not say so intentionally. On p. 10 of the booklet CARE OF THE FEET, (for which send 25c and stamped, self-addressed envelope) I tell about the only cure I know—operation. You see, bunion is not a growth. It is primarily a partial dislocation of the great toe joint, with enlargement of the head of dislocated bone, a portion of which must be removed in order to reduce the dislocation and restore the function of the foot.

Cut in Funds for Dam Will Not Delay Work

Portland — (U.P.) — Col. T. H. Lipscomb, Portland district Army engineer, said Thursday a reduction to \$20,000,000 for The Dalles dam from the \$37,500,000 requested did not necessarily mean any delay in completion of the project.

Congress voted the money in winding up its session early this week.

Col. Lipscomb said the \$20,000,000 would be used for work on the spillway, powerhouse, a footbridge erected on The Dalles bridge piers, land acquisition and relocation of the first nine miles of Union Pacific railroad tracks and the Old Oregon Trail highway.

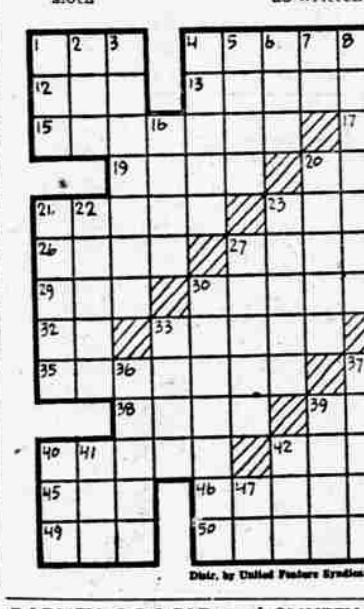
CROSSWORD PUZZLE

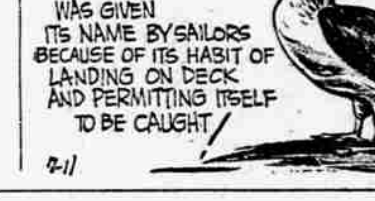

Prisoner Escapes in Grants Pass

Creswell, Ore. — (U.P.) — Sheriff Lloyd Lewis of Josephine county said today that Frank Taylor, 23, escaped from his custody here Thursday while being transported to the Oregon State prison from Grants Pass.

Lewis said Taylor, who was to serve two years for forgery, asked him to halt their car at a service station to use a rest room.

The sheriff determined from an attendant that there was "one door and a window" for the room and waited outside to watch each of the possible exits. But there was another door opening inside the station, the sheriff said, and Taylor used it to flee from the building.

Lewis said Taylor was about six feet tall, weighed 180 pounds and was of light complexion. He was wearing a red and black sport shirt, but had no hat.
