Emery Neale Cops Oregon Tennis Toga

Portland — (U.P.) — Emery Neale Monday was Oregon's tennis king for the seventh time. The tall Portlander won the state singles crown at Irvington Club Sunday by defeating Jerry DeWitts of Oakland, Calif., 6-4, 6-2, 6-1.

In the doubles match DeWitts and his 18-year-old partner, Herschel Hyde of Berkeley, Calif., turned the tables on Neale and his partner by outlasting him and his partner Sam Lee of Portland. The two California youths took the combination crown from its defenders, 7-5, 5-7, 5-7, 6-4, 6-1.

Peggy Mansel Wins
Women's single honors were won by Peggy Mansel of Santa Barbara, Calif., while Barbara Lum of Portland and Elizabeth Loesk of San Francisco copped the women's double title. Miss Mansel defeated June Lee of Portland, 3-6, 6-4 and 6-2. Miss Lum and Miss Loesk downed Mrs. Lee and Florabel Clough of Portland, 6-4, 6-1.

Cary Middlecoff St. Paul Winner

St. Paul — (U.P.) — Dr. Cary Middlecoff, who had been thinking of resuming his old practice of pulling teeth instead of digging divots, was a happy man Monday. He won the St. Paul open golf tournament — one which he almost passed up because "my game was awful." It was the second win in a row for Middlecoff, following his victory in the Motor City open at Detroit last week. "My game was so terrible prior to that tourney, I didn't think I'd play for awhile, just practice," Middlecoff said. Mind Changed But a Detroit victory changed his mind and he became a last-minute entrant in the St. Paul event. The dentist's game was never better. He wound up the 72-hole tourney here with a 266 — which tied the course record set last year by Lloyd Mangrum. That's 22 under par. Middlecoff's two partners on the final 18 were Sam Snead, White Sulphur Springs, W. Va., and Ory Ransom, St. Andrews, Ill. Snead finished second with a 271 and Ransom third with 272.

Raschi Tosses 100th Triumph

For a man who celebrated his fifth anniversary as a Yankee by pitching a one-hit victory, his 100th in the majors, slick Vic Raschi was surprisingly unhappy Monday. He tried with all the beard-down skill at his command to make it a no-hitter and was four putouts away when Joe Ginsburg, a .185 hitter, devastated the drama with an eighth-inning homer. Then Raschi went on to win, 11 to 1, and the Yankees went on to make it a double rout, 12 to 2, in the second game, but that didn't help his feelings a bit. Raschi, who joined the Yankees for good on July 13, 1947, said, "I never tried so hard for anything before."
