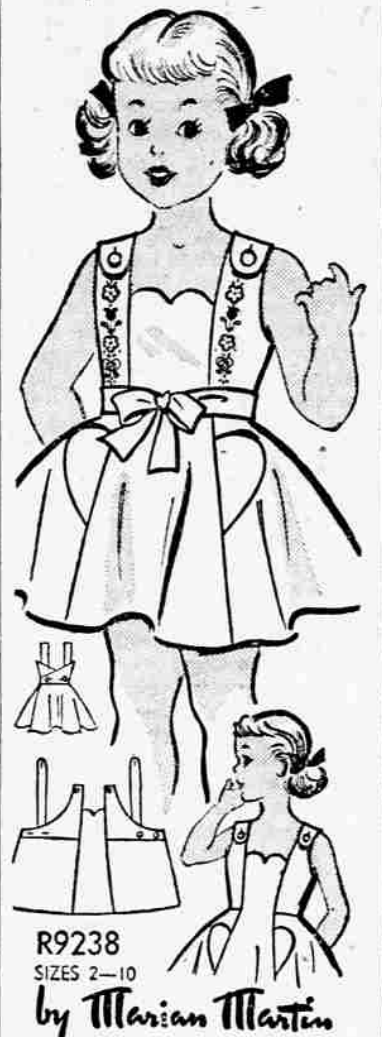
This was the fourth trip which Mr. Ekholm has made to Sweden since 1946, all being made by air.

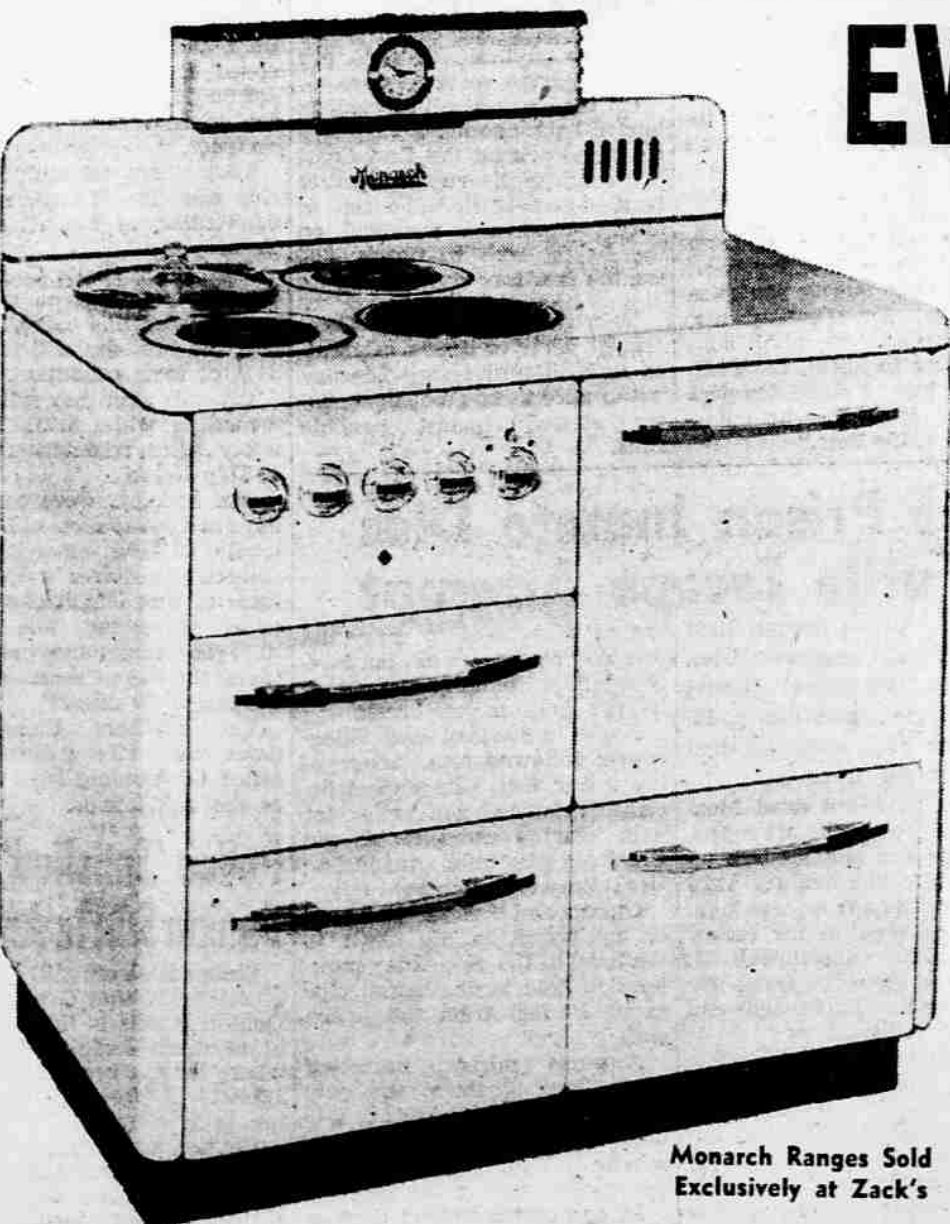
