Tribe Pulls Triple Steal

Rugged Al Rosen, who may go down as the first guy who ever worked the business end of a triple steal with a broken left foot, jubilantly joined his Cleveland boss, Al Lopez, Wednesday with a declaration that "the old Yankee Stadium jinx is smashed."
The hilarity came after the Indians topped the Yankees 7 to 3 Tuesday night, moving to within 2½ games of first place for their fourth victory in five starts in the Bronx ball park this year.
Rosen started things off explosively in a two-run first inning when with the bases loaded and without any instructions to do so, he took a long lead, "decided I could make it and just slid in." The other men on the base paths, Larry Doby and Luke Easter decided they had a chance, too, and moved up along with Rosen.

Christenberry ruled the fight a draw because the referee failed to mark his card correctly.
"I'm going to lay off for a month after this fight," Davey said. "I've been training for a solid year now, fighting at least once a month, and I'm tired."

Salem pulled away from Wenatchee with single tallies in the sixth and seventh innings. Salem Manager Hugh Luby and Wenatchee's Bud Hjelmae each collected a homer.

Horse Trainer Pistol-Whipped

Chicago — (U.P.) — A race horse trainer, who has been suspended twice for doping mounts, was treated for serious injuries Wednesday at St. Joseph's hospital after he was pistol-whipped by three men.

Leonard Wilson was on his way to Arlington park Tuesday when the assailants forced his car to halt with a volley of shots from a shotgun. The 43-year-old trainer told police one of the shotgun slugs hit his hat and another tore through the fender of his car.

Arm Broken
Three of the men slugged him with the butts of their pistols while the fourth slugged him with the stock of a shotgun, he said.

Physicians said he suffered a broken arm, a fractured left shoulder, a battered leg and a possible skull fracture.

5,226 Swim at Park During Past Month

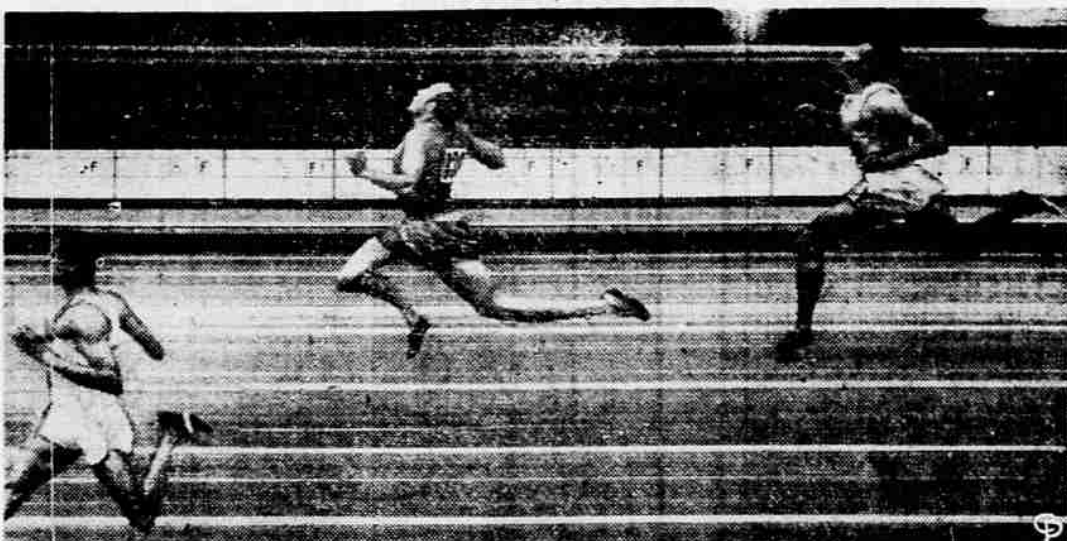

Detroit said the \$40 bills are worthless as they must have been issued by a state bank prior to the Civil War and are no longer valid.

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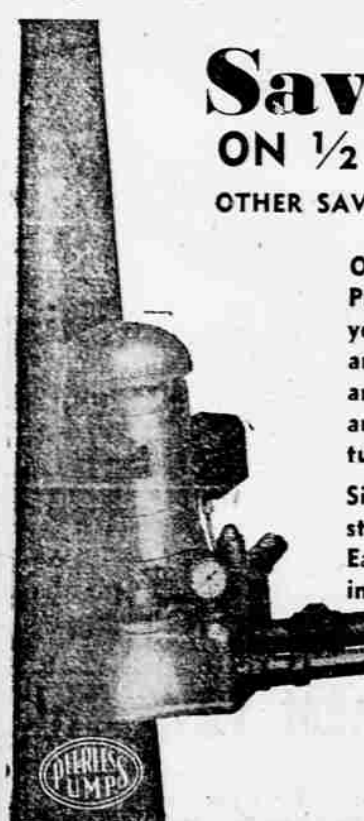
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
