Expected Truce Break; Premier's Resignation Best News of Week

Balance sheet for the week between good and bad news in the hot and cold wars:

GOOD NEWS

1. Communist truce negotiators in Korea at long last seemed in the mood to compromise their demand for forced repatriation of all war prisoners—the sole issue blocking an armistice. Red China's belated acceptance of the Geneva Convention on war prisoners indicated the Communists might propose that prisoners be placed in custody of a neutral power and their disposition settled after a cease-fire.

2. Iran's ultra-nationalist premier, Mohammed Mossadegh, who seized the Iranian properties of the British-owned Anglo-Iranian company and brought his country to the brink of bankruptcy, resigned. In his place, the Shah appointed Ahmed Qavam, who as premier in 1946 forced Russia to withdraw her troops from Iran. Qavam in the past has favored foreign investment in Iran and his return to the premiership may clear the way for a settlement of the Anglo-Iranian oil dispute.

3. Fifty-eight American Thunderjet fighter-bombers proved, in words of their commander, that they can "go anywhere, anytime, and in any numbers" by flying 11,000 miles in 12 days from Turner Air Base, Albany, Ga., to Japan.

BAD NEWS

1. Both the British government and the Church of England confessed themselves powerless to gag or oust Dr. Hewlett Johnson as dean of Canterbury Cathedral for spouting Communist propaganda. Prime Minister Winston Churchill and the archbishop of Canterbury explained that Johnson had not broken any law and had not committed heresy. Only 24 hours later, the dean made another speech echoing the Communist propaganda charge that the U. S. is waging germ warfare in Korea.

Foreign Policy Cracks

2. Britain's 12-year-old bipartisan foreign policy cracked wide open. Labor members of Commons announced they would vote against any ratification at this time of the separate West German peace treaty signed by Britain.

Swedish Proposal Rejected

3. Russia rejected a Swedish proposal to let the World Court investigate and decide whether, as Sweden claimed, Soviet jet fighters shot down an unarmed Swedish flying boat over international waters of the Baltic Sea last month. The Soviet note said the Swedish version of the incident was "devoid of all foundation." Russia has admitted the Soviet fighter planes fired on a Swedish flying boat, but insisted they did so only after the aircraft flew over Soviet territory and refused orders to land.

Runaway Grants Pass Boys Picked Up After Theft of Cars, Boats

Grants Pass—State police arrested two 14-year-old boys this week after a series of adventures and misadventures they went through as "runaways." Their activities included:

Theft of an automobile from a used car lot, which they abandoned in the Applegate after a tire blew out.

Theft of another automobile from its Applegate owner, which they drove to Prospect and back to Grants Pass, finally abandoning it.

Theft of a boat in Grants Pass, which they took down-river, where they found a raft. They abandoned the boat and stole the raft, which was of lumber with two airplane wing tanks.

The raft collapsed, dumping the boys in the river. They escaped, but lost bedrolls, stolen guns and other equipment. They made their way to the Galice ranger station, where they were picked up by police.

Alben Barkley in Chicago Seeking Demo Nomination; Colonel Arvey Meets Veep

Chicago (U.P.)—Vice President Alben W. Barkley arrived Friday to steam up his presidential bid and marched a jaunty half mile up Michigan Avenue in defiant taunt to those who say he's too old.

The 74-year-old vice president, who arrived by train with Mrs. Barkley from Paducah, Ky., was greeted by a crowd of 300 at the station.

Arvey in Group
They included Chicago Democratic Leader Jacob M. Arvey, who strode up the Avenue with Barkley on the five-block walk to the Conrad Hilton Hotel.

Barkley told newsmen that his campaign "looks very good, from all I understand." He said he was "confident of victory."

Asked on what ballot he expects to win the Democratic presidential nomination, Barkley quipped: "Any old ballot will suit me."

Smiling and waving cheerily, Barkley swung up the Avenue as marching Kentucky partisans sang "My Old Kentucky Home."

"I used to walk, this same route when I didn't have the price of a taxi," Barkley remarked. "Of course that was during a Republican administration."

Kentucky Governor

Walking abreast with Barkley were his wife, Arvey, Gov. and Mrs. Lawrence Wetherby of Kentucky, and Cook County, Ill., Commissioner Arthur Elrod.

Elrod, a pledged Barkley delegate from Illinois, and Senate Secretary Leslie L. Biffle boarded the train at the Englewood station on Chicago's South Side and rode into the main depot with the "Veep."

Arvey said he expected to confer with Barkley again later today. But he would not comment on the chances that he may

swing his support to him. Walk Not Long Enough
When the procession reached the hotel, Barkley waved to the crowd and said, "This walk wasn't nearly as long as I thought it would be and I hoped it would be."

Mrs. Barkley, in a blue dress and blue-veiled hat, appeared to enjoy the walk as much as her husband. Her youngest daughter, 17-year-old Jane Hadley, walked in the procession.

Barkley backers claimed that he is much more than a "compromise contender" for the nomination and is gaining strength steadily.

Some predicted he will get between 150 and 200 votes on the first ballot.

'India for Veep' Campaign Gets Underway in Chicago

Chicago (U.P.)—Volunteer workers at the newly-opened "India for Veep" headquarters were busy Friday ordering campaign ribbons and handbills to boom Mrs. India Edwards for vice president.

Backers of the vice chairman of the Democratic National Committee went to work at the Conrad Hilton Hotel buttonholing delegates for their support.

39 States Back India

Mrs. Mary T. Norton, former Democratic congresswoman from New Jersey, who with Mrs. Julia Crews, prominent New York Democrat, originated the move in June, is due to arrive Saturday. Their proposal now has organized backing in 39 states.

"We are very serious about

our candidate," said Mrs. Frances G. Satterfield, Atlanta, Ga. "This is not just a public gesture."

A similar move was afoot to put up the name of Judge Sarah Hughes of Dallas for the No. 2 spot on the Democratic ticket. No official headquarters have yet been opened on her behalf.

May Be Too Early

Mrs. Elizabeth Conkey, national committeewoman from Illinois and official hostess for the convention, conceded that it may "still be a little early this year" to get a woman nominated.

"Women should realize this and not get their feelings hurt," she said. "Nor should they allow themselves or their women candidates to be embarrassed."

Legion Commander Named Delegate Head

Commander Hugh Williams of Medford Legion Post 15 was elected chairman of the Medford delegation to the American Legion state convention during a dinner meeting of delegates and alternates this week.

The convention will be held July 25 to 30 in Klamath Falls. In his acceptance speech, Williams urged rapid payment of 1953 dues. Adjutant Roy Stoy said new membership cards should be ready for delivery by the end of this week.

After a short talk on the state convention by Leo Williams, vice-chairman Ralph Ettel reported on the success of the Boys State convocation at Salem. He said it was the biggest since before World War II.
