San Francisco — (U.P.) — Hollywood's great big righthander, who may be pitching his way back to the big leagues, goes after his 15th victory of the season Friday night. And he also has a chance to stretch his team's win streak to eight in a row.

He's Johnny Lindell, the Pacific Coast league's winningest pitcher. A former Yankee, Lindell has had major loop experience both on the hill and in the outfield.

So impressive has he been for the Stars this season, he is considered salable to a pennant contender in the race for the world series.

Divide Honors

Two of Lindell's mates, Red Munger and Jim Walsh, divided a four-hitter last night to beat San Diego, 2-1, before more than 9,000 fans. Munger again injured a shoulder muscle in the fourth inning and left the game.

Carlos Bernier, a \$3,500 steal who is making the league bargain conscious, stroked home the tally that gave Hollywood its seventh in a row.

Oakland kept a game off the pace by downing Seattle, 7-3. John Van Cuyk's superb relief pitching got the victory for starter Lloyd Hittle. Van Cuyk allowed one hit in four innings and fanned the side in the ninth.

Triple Aids

Oakland's big blow was Hank Schenz' triple with the bags full in the sixth. Johnny Ostrowski had four for five. And Sammy Chapman, a former All-American footballer and ex-major league star, rapped out three, one a double.

Los Angeles and Portland split, the Bevos winning the short opener, 4-2, and the Angels taking the nightcap, 5-2. And, before 500 fans, San Francisco won its third straight from Sacramento, 7-2.

Lefty Joe Hatten, who worked such a beautiful four-hitter in winning Tuesday, threw one-pitch to Joe Brovia and got the Angel loss. Brovia tapped the pitcher for a bloop single and batted in Frank Austin.
