Eagle Point, CP Winners In Softball

Central Point moved into a first place tie in the Medford Softball association men's league Thursday night by lashing YMCA 11 to 0 as Vern Collins pitched two-hit ball and struck out nine men. Central Point and Camp White now have four wins and one loss each.

In the other game of the evening Thursday Eagle Point gained a first place knot with the Medford Crater Babes in the women's circuit by bouncing the Babes 3 to 1.

Central Point rapped out 11 hits, four of them doubles, in beating the Y. The pointer nine got three runs in the first inning on two hits, a walk and an error and four runs in the second on three bingles, a walk and a misplay. Another run crossed in the third on a double by Collins and a hit by Homer Sullivan.

Three More Runs

The Central Point team added three more scores in the fourth on doubles by Collins and Joe Fenton, a hit by Sullivan and two errors.

Collins walked two men and unleashed one wild pitch. He had errorless field support.

In the girls' game Eagle Point took a 1 to 0 lead in the third frame and added another two runs in the fifth. Medford scored its single run in the sixth on a double by Mason and an error.

Butte Falls and Central Point play a girls' tussle at 7:30 o'clock at the high school and Central Point and National Guard men's teams battle. The Central Point nine has a chance to gain lone league leadership.

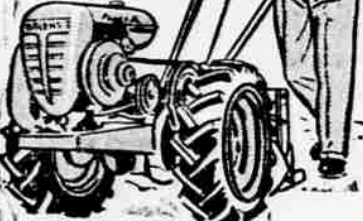

The most recent loop statistics show Frank Roelandt of Medford ranking 17th among hitters and Snuffy Smith of the Studs holding 19th position. Roelandt is third in two base hits with five and Smith knotted for second in triples with two. Gehrman is tied for second in batters struck out with 37.

Of the top 19 hitters in the loop Drain has six and Coos Bay five.

Fishing Reported Good in Upper Rogue River Area

Portland — (U.P.) — The upper reaches of coastal streams and the rivers and lakes of southwest Oregon will provide fishermen with the best angling during the week-end, according to the Oregon State Game Commission's weekly fishing report.

The report by regions included:

Southwest: Rogue river trout fishing is good to excellent from Prospect to Muir creek, good from Dodge bridge to McLeod, and fair to good in Grants Pass area. Season for Chinook salmon over 20 inches is closed above Marial.

Big Chinook Taken

Salmon fishing at Winchester bay has been good with catches mostly of silvers. Some big Chinook have been taken the first of the week. Coastal lakes have been yielding some catches of trout on deep troll or still fishing. Catfish are biting on the coastal lakes.

Trout angling has been very good in North Umpqua river and water conditions are ideal. Summer steelhead are producing fair catches in both the Steamboat and Winchester areas. A few salmon and trout have been taken in the Main river.

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
