Rural Fire District Election Slated Monday at Central Point

Central Point—A rural fire district election for the Central Point area will be held tomorrow from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. at three polling places, according to officials of the present rural fire corporation.

Qualified voters in Precincts 28, 29, 30, 31, 70 and 71 may vote at the Howard school; voters in Precincts 65, 67 and 69 at West Side school; and voters in Precincts 72, 73 and 74 at Table Rock school.

Area of District

The area included in the proposed district is bounded on the north by all of lower Table Rock east through upper Table Rock and across Rogue river; on the east, south to the Crater Lake highway, east to Foothill road, south to Coker Butte road; on the south, west to Schulz road and the Table Rock Market road, south to De Barr road, south at Howard avenue across the Pacific highway and west to meet Ross lane; on the west, north paralleling Military road until it rejoins the Old Stage road, then west 1 1/2 miles, then north passing just west of Tolo to the Gold-ray dam and lower Table Rock.

Excluded within these boundaries is city property, railroad property and state forest patrol stations.

Also to be voted upon at the same election are five director positions to head the district in it is approved by the voters. Candidates for these offices are A. W. (Bill) Lingaas, Claude Hoover, John Wheeler, Dr. Alvin Roberts, A. C. Thompson and David DeArmond.

The district is being backed, according to its sponsors, to replace the present private rural fire department which they state has the following disadvantages:

"Disadvantages" Told

The insurance rating bureau will not give an insurance reduction which the present group has sought because there has to be an organized district before such approval can be given.

The present setup is not classified as a "regular" fire department.

Only a relatively small number of subscribers (350) now support the group.

Two Jailed, Fined After Altercation

Two Grants Pass men received jail sentences and fines in district court Saturday as the result of an altercation early yesterday morning at a service station at 1050 South Riverside avenue. They were charged with disorderly conduct.

James Carl Cloud, 28, was sentenced to six months in jail and fined \$100 and court costs, and Jack Cloud, 24, was given three months in the county jail and fined \$50, according to a court report.

John H. Tizek, station attendant, reportedly told the court that James Cloud, after the car occupied by the two men had been serviced, came up behind him, demanded \$2 of his money back and struck him. Tizek, it was said, grabbed a gun and held Cloud off, then the younger Cloud came up and was also held off by the gun.

The Clouds allegedly claimed that gasoline had been spilled in the process of filling the car.

Tizek received a cut over one eye.

Rural Areas Maintain Nation's Population

Corvallis—UPI—The nation's population is being maintained by the rural areas but is getting very little help from city-dwellers, according to Dr. Glenn A. Bakum, sociology professor at Oregon State College.

Dr. Bakum told a meeting of the Oregon State Institute for Town and Country Churches the net movement from farms to urban areas in the last 30 years has been 15-million persons. He said the younger and older age groups will be found in the rural areas, while the middle-age group dwells chiefly in the cities.
