Around Hollywood

Hollywood — (U.P.) — A low budget movie that pokes fun at high-budget Hollywood was banned from one theater and had the rest of movietown in a furor today.

This two-part epic, "Actors and Sin," was written, directed and produced by famed writer Ben Hecht. One episode, "Woman of Sin," is a comedy about a "Forever Amber"-type movie that turns out to have been written by a nine-year-old girl.

The manager of the high-tone Beverly Canon theater, which caters to cinema celebrities, took one look at the movie and cancelled it. Co-producer Sid Kuller then slapped a \$250,000 suit on the popcorn palace.

No Publicity Stunt
"This is no publicity stunt," fumed Kuller. "This picture got rave reviews in New York. But we didn't get any theater circuit bookings any place in the country. And then this theater cancelled."

The picture is pungent with such lines as "screenwriters are eccentric." Gen Fowler drove to work at MGM yesterday in a "hearse" . . . "all agents are idiots" . . . "the only way to get ahead in Hollywood is to make mistakes" . . . "you can't reason with writers; they're like lunatics."

The ads for the boudoir movie that the nine-year-old child writes say, "A motion picture of wisdom . . . and tangant passions." The moppet's mother complains that her little darling has been turning out these movie scripts since the age of three.

The theater manager said he banned "Actors and Sin" because "it lampoons Hollywood and ridicules the industry."

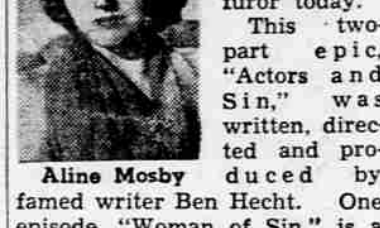
"The movie business is in enough trouble, without our adding to it by showing a picture that ridicules film-making," said Horace Boos.

In "Actors and Sin," the child prodigy's agent, Eddie Albert, works in an office filled with Hollywood-style Italian antiques and a bosomy, deadpan secretary, whom he regularly kisses with passion. He calls producers "Fatheads" behind their backs but smiles suavely when he talks to them on the telephone.

Actors and writers he won't even speak to.

The little girl is played by Hecht's own daughter, Jenny. "We shot the movie in eight days," explained co-producer Kuller. "We had fun making it and we didn't intend to offend Hollywood. Maybe you're not
