KOG Names Collins Interim Chairman

Private Services for Olcott Being Arranged

Portland — (U.P.) — Private funeral services were being arranged Tuesday for Ben Wilson Olcott, former governor of Oregon and a retired Portland banker, who died Monday at Physicians & Surgeons hospital. He was 79.

Olcott, a Republican, became governor March 3, 1919, on death of Gov. James Withycombe. Olcott at that time was serving his second elective term as secretary of state. He was appointed to that office in 1912 by his brother-in-law, Gov. Oswald West, a Democrat, to fill the unexpired term of Frank W. Benson, a Republican, who died in office.

Died in Sleep

His physician said the former governor died in his sleep. He had been in failing health for several years. His condition worsened about a week ago and he entered the hospital.

Olcott was born at Keithsburg, Ill., Oct. 15, 1872. He came west when he was 19 and considered Oregon his official residence from 1892 on. After a series of odd jobs he went prospecting in

the "Wild Horse" gold stampede in British Columbia in 1897. The gold fever hit him again in 1904 when he prospected between Nome and Fairbanks in Alaska. He was a gold dust teller and buyer for the Fairbanks Banking Co., in 1905-06.

During his gold rush days, Olcott "mushed" a dog team the entire 1,000 miles between Nome and Fairbanks and many stories were told of this feat.

Olcott entered his first public job in Oregon in 1907 when he was named to the State Land Board.

His term as governor expired Jan. 8, 1923, when he was succeeded by Walter M. Pierce. Olcott then returned to banking, serving successively as manager of the Long Beach, Calif., branch of the Bank of Italy, and director of the Oregon Mutual Savings bank at Portland. He retired several years ago.

His wife, the former Lena Hutten of Salem, died in 1936. Survivors include his three sons, Chester W., Yaquina, and Gordon W., and Richard H., both of Portland.

Phoenix to Select New Police Chief Tomorrow Evening

Phoenix — The selection of a police chief for the town of Phoenix will take place tomorrow evening in the city hall, according to Mayor E. R. Clafin.

The city council met last Wednesday with about 12 Phoenix businessmen and screened out all but two or three of ten applicants for the job vacated by Curt Fisher on July 1, according to Mayor Clafin. Although there was recent disagreement over the police department's budget for the new fiscal year between local businessmen and the council, the meeting was described as "very congenial" by the mayor.

The councilman position vacated by Cecil Norris at the July 7 meeting has not yet been filled, according to Mayor Clafin, but a replacement is hoped by the August 4 session.

HOW TO AVOID TAR STAINS

The summer months invariably mean going to the beach—hot pavements—in fact summer more often than not means tar stains.

Ordinary tar is not too difficult for us to remove, with just one proviso. Tar stains cannot be allowed to get old and harden, because when that happens, it is usually impossible to remove them.

We therefore recommend, if your garment acquires a tar stain, that you bring it in to us as soon after staining as you notice it. The same day, if possible, if not, the next day.

That way, by pointing out the stain to us, we can immediately attack it, and most likely get it out of the fabric entirely. If the tar stain is allowed to age and harden, it inevitably solidifies and at the same time imbeds itself in the fibres of the fabric . . . and the garment is ruined. Much too high a price to pay, when, caught a few days sooner, the stain might have been removed entirely and the garment restored good as new.

So please let us say it again for added emphasis: BE SURE TO BRING THE GARMENT IN AS SOON AFTER STAINING AS POSSIBLE.
