The Ladds recently celebrated their 10th wedding anniversary with a party at a local business-man's association for being "the most happily-wed" couple in Filmtown.

Many movie mates insist they are happy because their spouses stay far from the sound stages. But Ladd thinks his tie-up is for keeps because Sue knows almost as much about his job as he does. "In a marriage the woman has to be involved in the man's business," he decided. That's the most important thing. The man wants someone to talk to about his job. It brings them closer together."

AUTHORITY FROM OTHERS' BOOKS

People who have the habit of glancing at this column just to see what the conductor won't say next, ought to know that I do not pretend to be an authority on anything, except maybe the care and feeding of freighting stem briars and the decorum of the bowling green.

Every little while some one asks for my authority for this or that statement, teaching or advice. If such request is made with proper courtesy and accompanied with a stamped, addressed return envelope for my convenience I cite the authority—if I have any.

If such a request catches me fresh out of authorities I try to wriggle out of it with as much dignity as possible—unfortunately the very thought of pulling my dignity on any one is so amusing that I make a poor job of it.

Recent pieces about the atrocity known as tonsillectomy—I am the authority for this and I know of no other physician who calls the major operation an atrocity—brought some sharp reactions but, so far, no physician of standing has presented an answer to my "attack" in form fit to print.

One correspondent (who purports to be a physician (the name is not included in the latest medical directory) asks for the authority for my statement that tonsillectomy has a high mortality, that is, many victims of the atrocity die on the table or shortly after the operation gets through with them. Besides being discourteous and scurrilous this correspondent betrays singular ignorance of what is still happening with frightful frequency throughout the country, namely, failure of a child to recover from tonsillectomy.

The newspapers carry brief items telling of such tragedies, and readers clip and send me the items. I wish to heaven that such news items were the only authority for my condemnation of the atrocity. But, alas, despite my plea some bereaved parents write me heart-rending letters about it and I don't know what I'd like to say to the ever ready operators who inflict the atrocity on children who come under their care.

Another correspondent, coldly but courteously asked for my authority for the statement that malignancy might warrant or justify tonsillectomy rather than the minor operation known as tonsillectomy. But this physician did not send with his request a stamped, self-addressed envelope. So I'll say here what I

said when I made the statement, that in my opinion an attempt to remove every bit of tonsil tissue might be warranted if there is reason to suspect malignancy (cancerous change) in the tonsil.

As a general rule I take care to remind readers that a suggestion, theory or bit of advice is my own and that I am no authority. Or, if it is not just my notion I either name the authority for it or refer physicians to the authority if they ask me politely.

QUESTIONS & ANSWERS
Queer Pro or Proper?

Lady: Can this affect her mind? She is very queer. (Mrs. H. L. C.)

Answer—Not likely, although chronic lead poisoning has been reported in a few instances from use of lead salts in hair-dyes over a period of years, and chronic lead

But they all do their victims a lot of harm, causing or aggravating piles. Send stamped, self-addressed envelope and ask in writing (a clipping is likely to be missed in handling the mail) for pamphlet on PILES. Do

not bridle at the title on the pamphlet—that "Stupid" idea of the wicked quack who conducts this column.
