THIS LITTLE BOY CRIES AT NIGHT

My son is 5½ years old and weighs 54 pounds, writes Mrs. M. H. He complains of having sore feet and legs during the night and wakes up crying and holding his feet.

So far the boy's mother behaves well enough. But there follows the inevitable hokum bunk-

em: He has worn shoes with arches and right now wears shoes with a "cookie" in them and a triangular piece of metal in the heel.

His father has flat feet, so we took it for granted... The little boy's parents mean well, but it does seem regrettable that the child's trouble should be neglected while the parents spend time and money experimenting with this and that.

... took it for granted that

he did too, but the foot specialist in the shoe store said... everyone urges me to have him x-rayed.

This crying at night isn't every night, but only at intervals of a few weeks perhaps... (Mrs. M. H.)

True to type, Mrs. H. expresses her opinion of the case—you know, just as so many laymen do when they consult a physician—they want to help the doctor make a diagnosis. This little boy is "very heavy, so maybe that's why his feet ache" suggests his mother. And then, lest I get any wrong idea, she assures me the little boy has sufficient vitamins, thank you, for "he eats very heartily."

The little boy is, say, ten pounds heavier than the average—but this is only one factor—mother does not mention his height. But excess weight alone would hardly cause the trouble described.

Apparently it has not yet occurred to this little boy's parents to consult a physician. They are so preoccupied with the "foot specialist in the shoe store" and with everyone's advice about x-

I can assure Mrs. M. H. that millions of Americans, young and old, suffer from various vitamin and/or mineral nutritional deficiency troubles even though they eat heartily — of ultra-refined food.

As a diagnostician I have never set the world afire, especially via long distance, but I hope Mrs. H. will give her young son the benefit of (a) high calcium diet, (b) a suitable daily ration of calcium and vitamin D to supplement his diet, not for a week or two but for a year or more—this is not medicine, but merely food which the young body requires and too often does not get

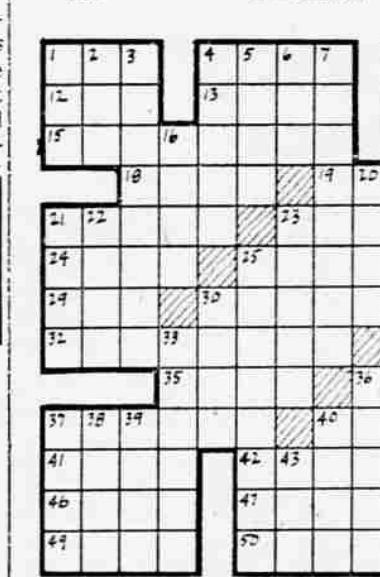

CROSSWORD PUZZLE

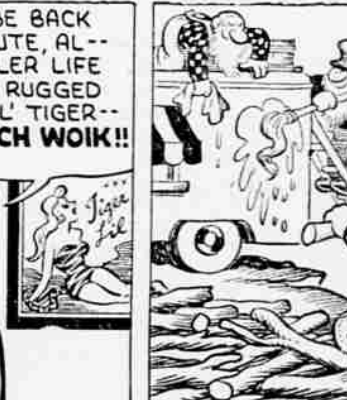

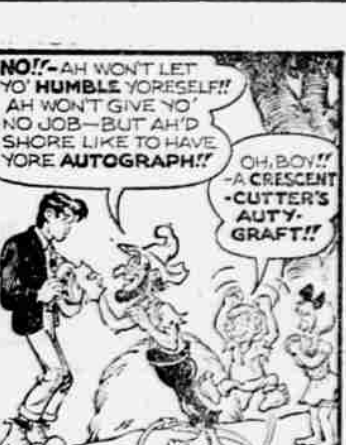
