Owyhee Canal Break Stops Irrigation

Ontario —U.P.— Forty-thousand acres of irrigated land was without water Tuesday because of a washout on the Owyhee north irrigation canal, 30 miles south of here.

The washout occurred Sunday when a 50-foot break appeared several miles north of Owyhee dam at a point where the canal banks are 25 feet high. No farm land was flooded by the released water, but 150 feet of the Owyhee dam highway was washed out.

Irrigation officials were unable to explain cause of the break.

Attempts are being made to repair the break by Thursday before appreciable damage is done to the irrigated acreage.
