Hollywood —(U.P.)—Comedian Ken Murray decided today small town girls make sexier and prettier show queens because they don't look so brainy.

The genial Murray is collecting shapely females for the fall re-opening of his CBS television variety show. To get this job you can't be a city slicker.

"All the girls on my shows are from small towns," reflected Murray while puffing on his usual long cigar.

"This is what I look for in a girl: She must look like a nice girl, not too smart, but a good-hearted girl. Her figure must be inviting. Her face must be beautiful, but innocent, like she is saying, 'I can't understand why you talk that way.'"

"Oh, those small town girls. I just love them," he sighed.

Has Drawn Look

"A big city girl usually has been a model. They gave her a certain kind of hair-do, and got her to lose weight and she lost those curves. A city girl gets that drawn look, sophisticated and smart."

"Same way with movie stars. Janet Leigh is from Merced, Calif., Lana Turner from Wallace, Ida., and Ava Gardner from Smithfield, N. C."

Murray admits he goes for "this corny approach because maybe I'm corny." His "black-outs" stage show, studded with such smalltown beauties as Marie Wilson and Rhonda Fleming, played to visiting tourists for seven years in Hollywood.

GROWTH OF THE NAILS

Once upon a time, believe it or not, I read a novel, namely "Growth of the Soil" by Knut Hamsun. I should have known better because I remember my high school English teacher, Miss Hudson, warning that the amateur carpenter would get little practical help.

from Carlisle's Notes on the construction of Sheepfolds. Hamsun gave me help in my gardening but once I got into his tale I did manage to stay till the finish — which was an achievement, in view of my ingrained aversion to fiction, except

mystery stories, which seems to have become extinct in the past twenty years.

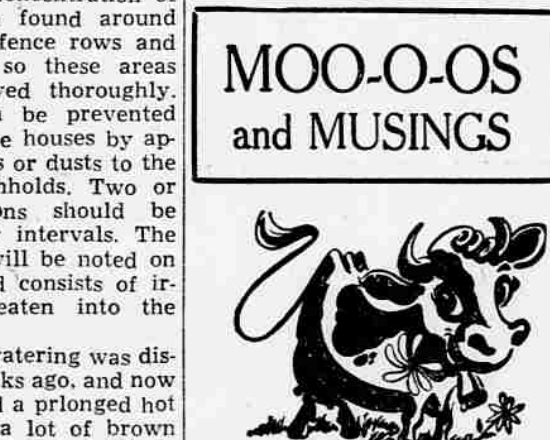
If there is such a thing as a nail, skin and hair tonic, believe me, children, you must eat it and not rub it on.

Truman Choice Leads In Arkansas Primary

Little Rock, Ark. —(U.P.)—Gov. Sid McMath, President Truman's personal choice for governor of Arkansas, held a lead Wednesday in the state Democratic primary, but faced a runoff election Aug. 12.

Returns early today from 2,186 of 2,267 Arkansas precincts showed McMath with 96,080 votes to 84,662 for Chancellor Francis Cherry of Jonesboro. Congressman Boyd Tackett had 60,961; former Attorney Gen. Jack Holt had 43,478 and Attorney General Ike Murry had 28,422.

A second primary is necessary under Arkansas law if no candidate has a majority of the votes cast.
