Civil Suit Seeks \$56,800 Damages

A civil suit asking \$50,000 general damages and \$6,800 special damages has been filed by Frank Rowe, general delivery, Trail, against the Southern Oregon Sugar Pine corporation, according to circuit court records.

The complaint alleges that logs on a truck fell upon Rowe and resulted in dislocation of the left knee, including rupture of certain ligaments, and a fracture of his right ankle, as well as other specific leg injuries. It further stated that Rowe was permanently injured and "will never again regain the full and complete use of his left knee." Carelessness and negligence on the part of the defendant was alleged in the complaint.

The injury occurred at the company's log pond on Nov. 7, 1950.

Two Make Innocent Pleas in Court

Two innocent pleas were entered Wednesday before Circuit Judge H. K. Hanna by Charles Edward Cooper, general delivery, Eugene, and Paul Raymond Scofield, Lake hotel, Medford, according to District Attorney Paul Haviland.

Both men had been indicted by previous grand juries, Scofield for larceny from a store building on April 18, and Cooper for attempting to obtain money under false pretenses.

Leland Henry Thomas, 52, of 308 "B" street, Eagle Point, pleaded guilty on district attorney's information to a charge of contributing to the delinquency of a minor girl on July 23. The case is being continued in the circuit court for sentencing, pending receipt of complete records.

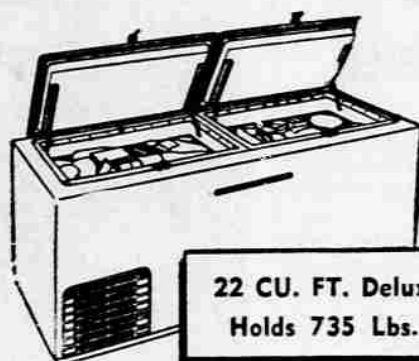
The "Cooties" and "Lady Bugs" are around every Thursday of every week distributing cigarettes to non-compensated

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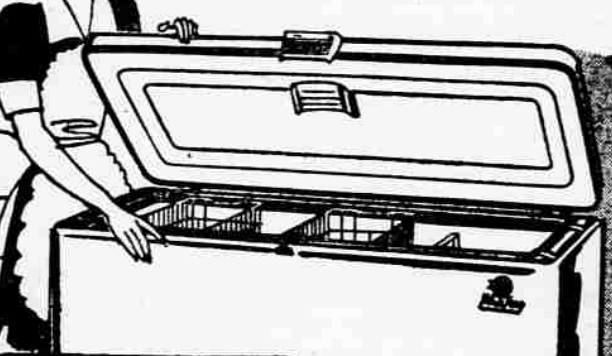
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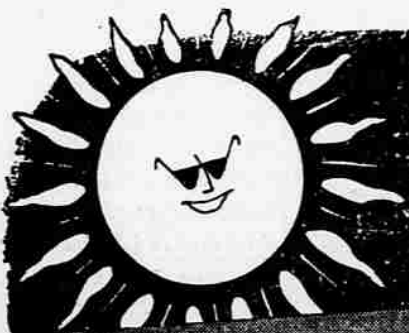
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
