Past Chiefs' Club

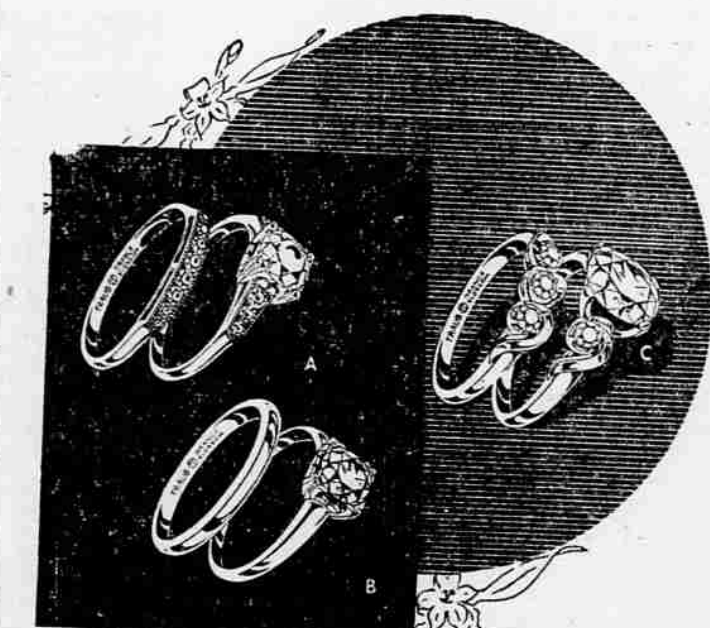
