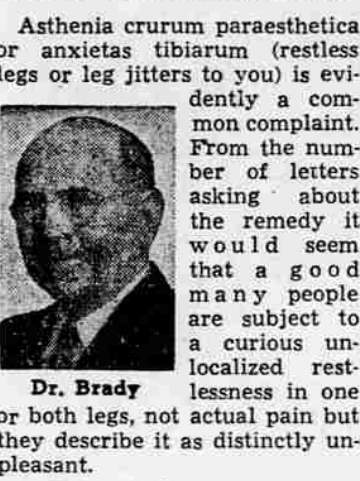

DON'T CONFUSE RESTLESS LEGS WITH LEG CRAMPS

As the crumpling paraesthesia or anxiety tibia (restless legs or leg jitters to you) is evidently a common complaint. From the number of letters asking about the remedy it would seem that a good many people are subject to a curious unlocalized restlessness in one or both legs, not actual pain but they describe it as distinctly unpleasant.

Rebutting the legs does no good. They generally get up and walk about for relief.

A nitroglycerin tablet, dissolved in the mouth, relieves the discomfort in only a minute or two. Nitroglycerin—why that is dynamite! Or at least dynamite is nitroglycerin absorbed in some porous material.

Knowing that the mention of nitroglycerin always causes that reaction I mentioned in the article about restless legs that instructions for the use of nitroglycerin are given in the booklet CVD—for a copy of the booklet send twenty-five cents and stamped, self-addressed envelope.

One fifth of the persons who

sent for the booklet sent the booklet right back with some pretty waspish comments for there was nothing about nitroglycerin for restless legs in the booklet...

In a way that is true. Nothing about restless legs in the booklet, but on p. 24 instructions for the use of nitroglycerin are given nevertheless, and the instructions are the same whether you take it for relief of jittery legs, for angina pectoris, or for intermittent claudication. By this I mean to imply that, in my experience and judgment any one may take a 1/100th of a grain tablet (or perhaps one on-half of such a tablet, 1/200th of a grain) of nitroglycerin with impunity and repeat the dose every few hours if it gives relief.

Many persons with restless legs have received all kinds of ineffectual treatment under the

presumption that the trouble is "nervous." Oh, well, the drugless therapists have to make a living.

Do not confuse restless legs with leg cramps, which occur in growing children and in adults of mature age, particularly at night, and in my opinion, are usually the manifestation of tetany—not tetanus. If the trouble is leg cramps send a stamped envelope bearing your address and ask in writing (clipping will not rate a reply) for the pamphlet **Adult Tetany and Growing Pains**.

The first and only thought of too many reckless people with leg cramps or restless legs is a sedative, narcotic or sense-deadening drugs—one of the barbiturates (sleeping tablets), a bro-

midle or maybe aspirin.

To these reckless ones I say—even with growing pains, leg jitters and leg cramps this world is probably not much worse than the next, so why hurry off?

QUESTIONS & ANSWERS
I Recommend a Change of Doctors
Why do you recommend a change of doctors if a doctor tells a patient he has heart murmur? Once both the family doctor and the school doctor diagnosed my condition (on the health records) as heart murmur. I am over it now but I had faith in both doctors. (Miss J. C.)

Answer—If the doctor tells the patient or the patient's relatives or friend what ails the patient, if anything, the mention of "murmur" doesn't matter. On the other hand if the doctor mutters about a heart murmur but fails to express an opinion concerning the patient's ailment, if any, that is not worth the price and I recommend a change of doctors. You see the mere presence of a soft blowing does not necessarily signify either heart disease or heart weakness. So the doctor should keep his

trap closed about it or else tell the patient frankly that he or she doesn't know what it means. There are too many unhappy people worrying through life with imaginary "heart trouble" or "weak heart" so caused.
