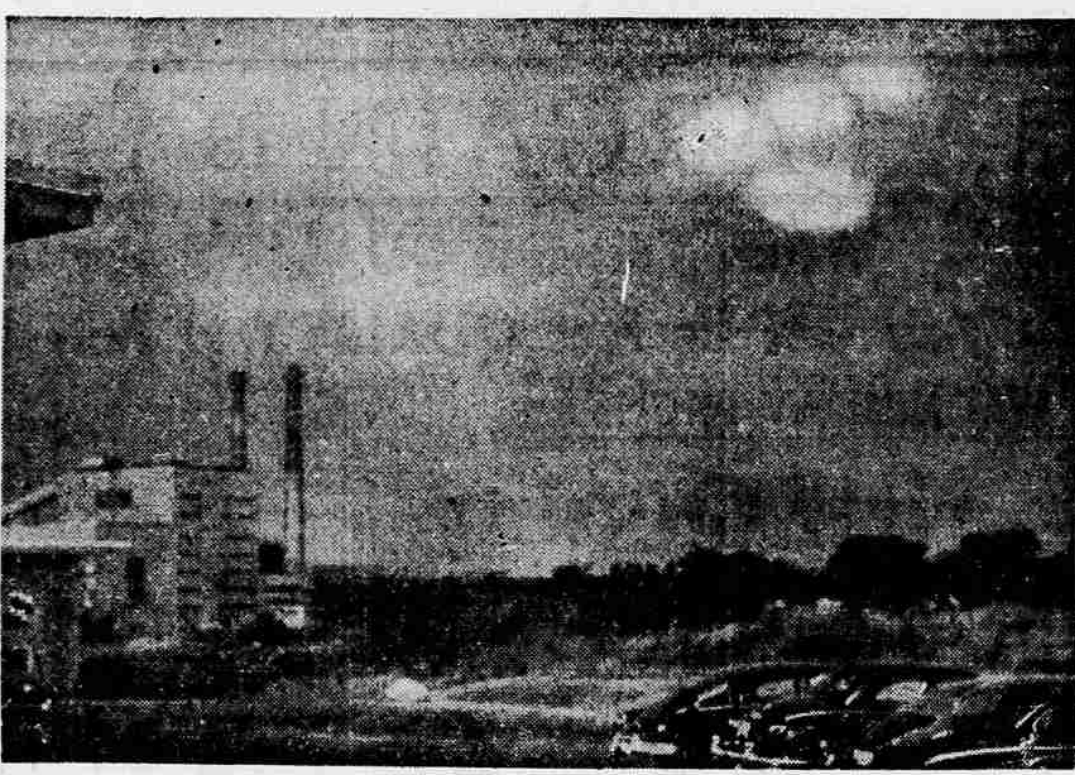

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August Sky Review

The planets Venus and Mercury are setting a little after sundown, but they are so nearly in the direction of old Sol that they are hidden in his rays.

Mercury apparently is drawing nearer the sun, but Venus is getting farther from it and around the middle of the month can be sighted very low in the west in the early twilight. Venus' position will improve during the rest of the year and late in December it will serve as a gorgeous Christmas star.

The brilliant planet Jupiter is now rising slightly north of east at about midnight standard time and by sunrise is high in the south. It is by far the brightest star-like object now visible in the night sky.

Four Bright Objects. For the evening sky, let us observe around an hour after sunset. There is a long, irregular line of four bright objects rather low across the southwest. They start slightly west of south and extend to the west southwest. Three are of nearly equal brightness; the other is considerably more luminous. Two are decidedly red.

At the left of this line we find the red star Antares, mentioned last week as the throbbing heart of the Scorpion. Farther right is another red object—the planet Mars. Notice that Antares twinkles while Mars does not. This behavior is a characteristic difference between stars and planets. The next two are more white in color. The star Spica comes next after Mars, then at the far right of the string of celestial jewels we find the planet Saturn. Note that this line moves westward as the evening advances.

Orange Star Prominent. Very high in the western heavens—and towards the southwest—the orange star Arcturus is prominent at the lower end of the Kite. Note the little stars above Arcturus which complete the large figure. To the left of the top of the Kite, a small half circle of little stars outlines the Northern Crown.

High in the northwest the Big Dipper slides down toward the north, bowl first. If you are not farther south than latitude 45 degrees and your landscape is level, you will see the bright

A Nichols' Worth of— Comment On This and That

Washington — (U.P.) — Maybe we've got this saucer business licked. Not the flying kind, but the saucer that holds the cup.

A friend of mine has invented a drip-proof saucer, he claims, that is not a mirage. The inventor is Frank Holeman. He is one of the three

Daily News men who have formed a corporation with the idea of going into production as soon as they can find a financial angel. The other two are Ted Lewis and Gus Tarry.

Frank got his idea while eating lunch one day. He had on a clean white shirt and a bright red bow tie. He took a sip of his coffee and the spill-over collected on the bottom of the cup—as it always does. A blob scored a near miss on the tie and landed on Frank's shirt.

Right there lightning struck and an inventor was born. Frank took the rest of the day off. He went to a dime store and bought the kitchen table variety of saucer and a packet of kid's modeling clay. He fashioned some ridges in the bottom of the saucer, let it dry and tried it out. The idea worked. No drip. The drip dripped off the bottom of the cup into the ridges. It was that simple.

The same day he took his brainchild to a patent attorney. The lawyer said for a \$15 fee he would have a search made at the patent office to see if there was anything like it on the market. The results was patent No. 2-536,936.

All of this was running into more money than Frank could afford so he gathered in Ted and Gus as partners. Gus, a telegraph operator at the News, acted as the "front man" and got an Austrian expert on pottery to make a model.

There the matter rests. Although certain people with money have expressed an interest, enough capital still hasn't shown up.

Invents Other Things. Frank has been inspired to invent a few other things.

One was a bathtub brush to allow a lady to scrub her tub without breaking her back—from a standing position. That one was never patented.

"It seems there isn't much that hasn't been invented," Frank says.

But he went ahead anyhow and thought up a deck of cards to teach the kids their multiplication tables. The cards were cut in two like a jig-saw puzzle. For instance one card contained three times eight, six times four and two times 12—all, of course coming out at 24.
