

Hospital Board Increase to 11; Members Elected

The number of members on the board of directors of the Community hospital were increased from nine to eleven at a meeting here Friday afternoon. Two new directors were named, and officers of the board were elected.

The Rt. Rev. Benjamin Dagwell, bishop of the Episcopal diocese of Oregon, presided at the annual meeting. The resignation of Allen Smith from the board was accepted, and the board tendered him thanks for his many years of service to the hospital.

New Members

Two new board members, A. A. Lausmann and Jack Crawford, were elected at the meeting. Other board members include Bishop Dagwell, Mrs. Leonard Carpenter, Leon Boomer, the Rev. George R. V. Bolster, rector of St. Mark's Episcopal church, Alfred S. V. Carpenter, Eugene Thorndike and Otto Frohnmayer. One additional member, to make a total of 11, will be elected later.

Bishop Dagwell was elected president of the board, and Mr. Bolster was named vice president. Norris was elected secretary and Thorndike treasurer.

Bishop Dagwell, who has been head of the hospital since it was taken over by the Episcopal diocese earlier this year, named Alfred Carpenter to head the board's finance committee; Mr. Bolster to head the executive committee, and Boomer to head the buildings and grounds committee.

Three physicians, Drs. Russell Barnes, L. D. Inskip and W. W. Stevenson, were appointed to form a liaison committee from the medical staff to work with the executive committee on hospital matters.

Accept Resignation

The board accepted the resignation of Miss Ruth Nelson as superintendent of the hospital, and extended to her the board's appreciation for "long and faithful service." Candidates for appointment to succeed Miss Nelson are being interviewed. In the interim, Robert Wilkins of the staff of the Good Samaritan hospital in Portland is acting administrator.

In other action, the board voted to expand anesthetic services, and to employ an additional anesthesiologist at the hospital. Applicants are now being screened for this position.

Plans for Disaster To Be Considered

A meeting to plan the organization of volunteer service units at key points throughout the county for food, clothing and shelter in any disaster, will be held at 10 a.m., Friday, August 8, at the Lincoln school gymnasium, it was announced today.

Mrs. Katharine Chambers, a disaster field representative for the American Red Cross, will be the main speaker, and will assist in getting the units organized on an effective basis. Mrs. Chambers is one of the Red Cross "trouble shooters," who is assigned to most major disasters, and will bring personal experience to assist the Jackson county people who are setting up the organizations.

Members of Grange home economic units (which have been assigned an important role in the plan), representatives of Parent-Teacher groups in the county, and members of Home Extension units, as well as Red Cross volunteer service workers, will attend.

Further announcements of progress in the work will be made from time to time, a Red Cross spokesman said, including notice of an experiment in mass feeding techniques to be conducted by the Roxy Ann Grange.

Gasoline Test Car Coming Here Tuesday

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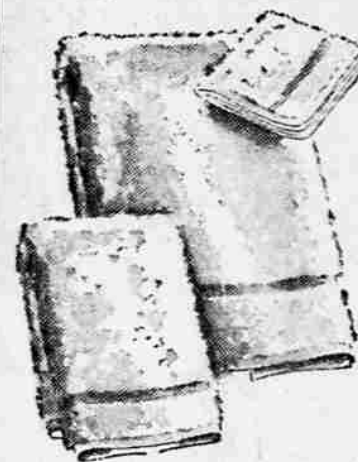

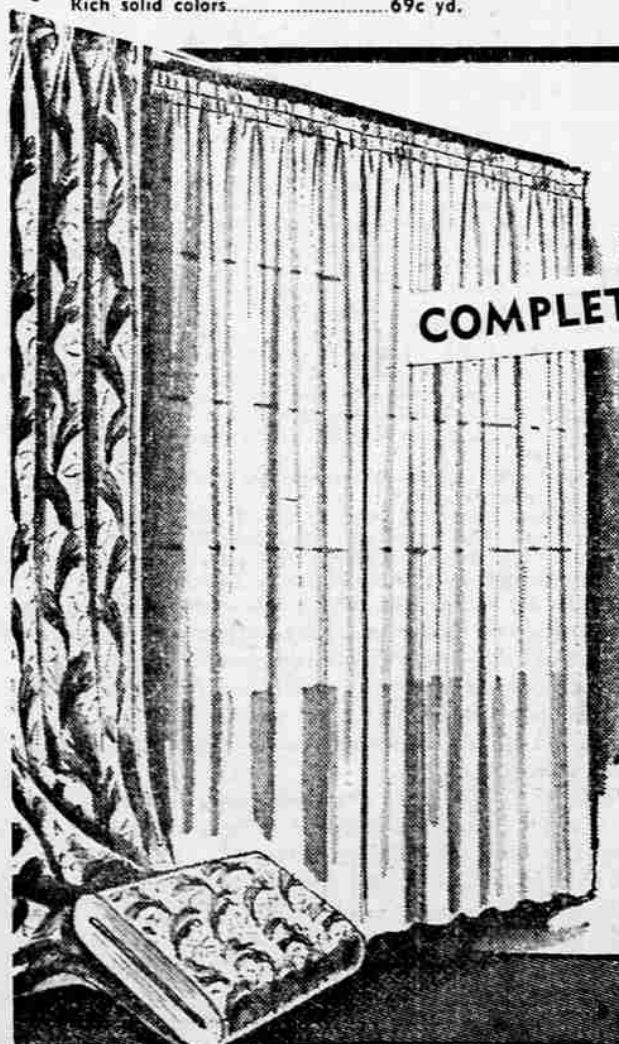
