PLAYING FAVORITES HURTS ALL CHILDREN IN FAMILY

Playing favorites is one of the most unfair things parents can do. It is not only unfair to the child who is the favorite but also to the other children in the family. That is why this boy should take action:

Q. "I am 9 years old and have two sisters. One day, my small sister, who is 6½, became ill and had a temperature of 101. My mother and father waited on her hand and foot. They even tried bribing her. My relatives tried to stop them from spoiling her but it did no good. She gets double ice cream allowance twice a day while my sister and I get it only every two days. Please tell me what I can do about this."

A. Why don't you and your older sister have a heart-to-heart talk with your parents about the way they are spoiling your younger sister? They may not realize just what they are doing or how you and your sister feel about it.

Dr. Hurlock: A family is often spoiled as your sister is. But it certainly is not fair to her nor to you and your sister. Let your parents know how you feel about the matter and why you are asking them to change their tactics.

Tell them that you and your sister naturally cannot feel as kindly toward the little girl as you would like to because of their favoritism. As the youngest, she certainly is not entitled to as big an allowance as you and your sister get because she does not need as much money as you do.

Too Much Ice Cream
As for the ice cream, that's bad for her. Once a day is plenty while twice a day is much too

much. Why shouldn't she get ice cream only every other day, as you and your sister do, unless the doctor has specifically ordered this extra ice cream to build her up.

When a child is sick, parents sometimes become scared when the temperature is high and try to bribe the child to take fluids or the medicine the doctor prescribes. But a temperature of 101 degrees is not high and should not cause real concern. If they would tell her firmly to do what the doctor wanted her to do, they could get the same results.

NATURAL SKIN OIL THE IDEAL COSMETIC

A manicurist asks whether the general health affects the condition of the nerves. She has believed for

years that nails with ridges, nails that peel and flake like powder when filed reflect systemic disorders. But in her work it is all blamed on her, or rather on

the coats of nail polish she applies. So if I have any literature that would help her to convince her customers that the split nails are not her fault she'll be grateful.

Recently a reader complained that her reaction to nail polish is red, swollen, itchy eyelids. For this reason she has not worn nail polish for three years. It is getting her down, gives her an inferiority feeling when she has to show her hands in the company of women who are all painted up. Isn't there some kind of non-allergic nail polish?

My unsympathetic answer to that brought an indignant rejoinder from another reader who says it is evident that I do not come in contact much with women in these parlous times, and she presumes I do not allow my wife and daughters—if I am so fortunate—to use cosmetics and nail polish, but I probably take a second look at the woman who does, and admire her. She asks whether I go out in public without shaving or grooming my nails. Finally she offers to tell my reader who is allergic to ordinary nail polish the name of the much-coveted nail polish she uses, as she had to give up ordinary nail polish for the same reason.

In rebuttal I never use the stuff. I hate the sight of it. Nail polish, hair frizz or any other artifice that screams to high heaven that it is fake. I admire the woman who uses cosmetics in an attractive, feminine way—and that means that she has to take at least a second look to discover that she uses any artifice at all.

I began supplementing my diet with Ca, P, I and D and B complex as you advise in the

pamphlet (Young Folks and Old Folks) last spring... nails began to grow beautifully and became strong and smooth again.

What causes my nails to become bumpy and get pinholes—does nail polish or cuticle oil affect the nails like this?

What a dreadful fate it would be if you creatures were deprived of your nail paint and had to wear the nails God gave you!

Nail "polish" or polish remover as well as "cuticle oil"—baa, baa—is injurious to the nails, of course. Any strong solvent injures nail, skin or hair. But these abuses alone do not account for the ridges, the flaky peeling, cracking, splitting and other changes the readers complain of. The main cause of such poor condition of the nails is nutritional deficiency—especially lack of sufficient vitamin B complex, vitamin D and calcium
