Symington Holds Big Lead Over Opponent In Missouri Election

Stuart Symington, former White House trouble shooter rebuffed by President Truman, and Sen. Blair Moody, "young Turk" Democrat, took strong early leads in their state primaries Tuesday.

Symington, a novice in state politics, was piling up an ever-widening margin over State Attorney General J. E. Taylor, endorsed by the President, for Democratic nomination for U.S. senator from Missouri.

Moody in Runaway
Moody, a leader of the liberal

wing of the party, was scoring a runaway victory for nomination to the Senate in voting in Michigan.

In the third state primary Tuesday a feud among traditionally rock-solid Republicans of Kansas lived up to the balloting.

Symington, first secretary of the Air Force and later clean-up chief of the Reconstruction Finance Corporation, was leading in rural Missouri, where Taylor managers had looked for an edge, and in Jackson County (Kansas City), traditionally a Truman stronghold.

Tabulations Delayed
Vote tabulations were delayed in some counties because of a heavy turnout.

Returns from 3,045 of the state's 4,732 precincts gave 242,492 to Symington and 100,546 to Taylor.

Moody, author of the "loyalty pledge" which almost drove Southern states out of the National Convention last month, had only token opposition, as was expected, from his only opponent, Louis C. Schwinger.

Returns from 2,453 of Michigan's 4,467 precincts gave 195,816 to Moody and 31,855 to Schwinger.

Intra-party feuding focussed on the race for the GOP nomination for lieutenant governor in Kansas City.

Incumbent in Close Lead
Incumbent Fred Hall clung to an unsteady lead over State Sen. Wayne Ryan.

Ryan had the support of Gov. Edward F. Arn although Hall was Arn's running mate in 1950.

Arn turned his back on the present lieutenant governor when Hall accused segments of the state GOP of "buying and selling" legislative influence through campaign contributions.

Returns from 2,050 of the state's 2,850 precincts gave 83,498 to Hall and 77,238 to Ryan.

Auction Sale of Indian's Timber Brings \$18,865

Hood River — (U.P.)—Eighty acres of timber, belonging to an Indian named Jim Slim Jim, was sold on the courthouse steps here Tuesday for \$18,865, which was \$17,865 more than the Indian received when he first sold it in May of 1951.

Jerry Clinton, Parkdale, bid \$24.50 per thousand for the estimated 770,000 board feet of timber on the Indian's land, located three miles east of here.

Order Cancels First Sale
The sale was conducted by Kenneth Abraham, the Indian's attorney. It was brought about by court orders obtained by Slim Jim's guardian, Mrs. Arline Moore.

The Indian originally sold the timber to Fred M. Marsh, Lebanon, for \$1,000. However, after friends of the Indian filed suit to cancel the sale several months later Marsh settled by returning the timber to the Indian and taking back the \$1,000.

Investigation Started
Details of the original transaction published by newspapers, started an investigation into Indian land sales in Oregon.

The money is expected to be paid to the Indian at \$75 per month, with possibility it will be raised to \$100 a month later on.

Free Bus Tickets Given For Great Britain Use

New York — (U.P.)—Holders of free bus tickets given away here will have to travel about 3,000 miles if they wish to use them.

The stubs were handed out Tuesday by drivers and maintenance men of three British double-decker buses which have completed a 12,000-mile good will tour of the United States and Canada.

The buses were loaded aboard the Cunard liner Parthia, which sails for London Wednesday.

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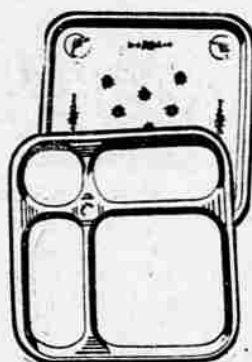
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Earl of Dalkeith Will Wed Ex-Model

Dalkeith has been a lifelong friend of Princess Margaret and their names have been linked romantically by London gossips for many months.

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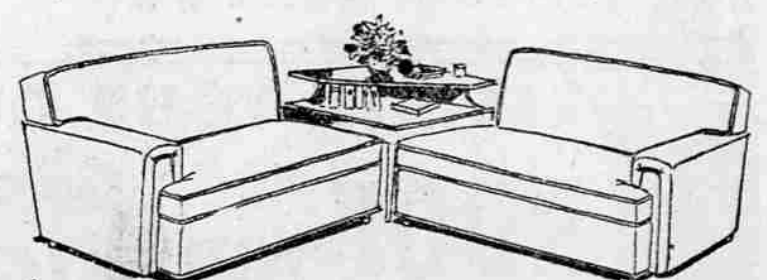
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
