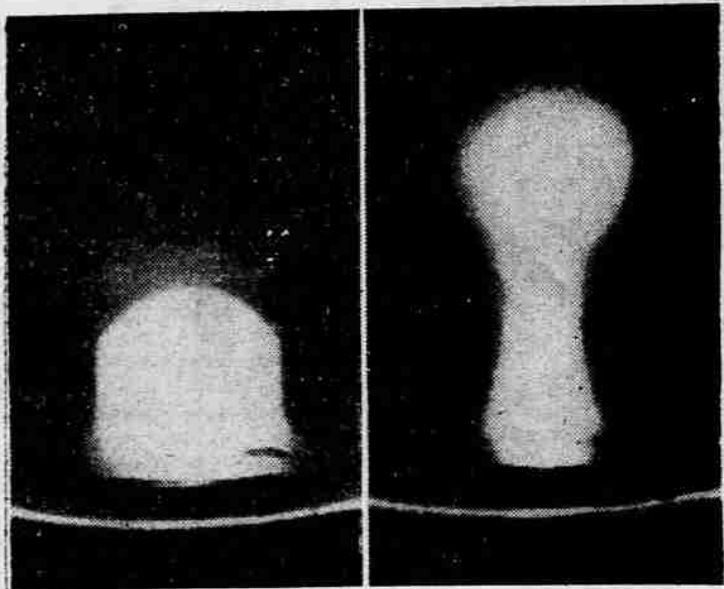

McKellar Unseated, Browning Defeated In Tennessee Vote

Nashville—(U.P.)—Rep. Albert Gore unseated 83-year-old Sen. Kenneth McKellar who was seeking an unprecedented seventh consecutive term in the Senate and Attorney Frank Clement defeated Gov. Gordon Browning Friday in Tennessee's Democratic primary.

Significant Developments

The primary produced several significant political developments:

1. It removed the aging McKellar from the Senate seat he has held for the past 36 years and will leave vacant the chairmanship of the powerful Senate Appropriations committee and the post of Senate president pro tem, both of which McKellar held, when Congress reconvenes next January.

2. It clouded the hopes of Memphis political leader Ed Crump for a statewide comeback in Tennessee politics. While Crump lost in backing McKellar, he picked a winner in endorsing Clement, a 32-year-old former G-man for governor.

3. It spelled a partial defeat for Sen. Estes Kefauver who had reluctantly injected himself into the gubernatorial race in defense of Browning after Browning had been attacked for his role in the Democratic National Convention where the Tennessee delegation voted against seating Virginia because it would not take the so-called loyalty pledge. Kefauver pointed out that he and not Browning was responsible for the Tennessee vote, but states' rights adherents continued angered over what they considered an affront to a sister state.

The 44-year-old Gore piled up a 65,000 vote lead in his triumph over McKellar. Returns from 2-110 of the state's 2,423 precincts gave Gore 246,540 votes to McKellar's 181,021. In the governor's race, with 2,103 precincts reporting, Clement had 222,991 votes to 201,313 for Browning.

Rhee Feels Talks Won't Bring Peace
Panmunjom, Korea — (U.P.) — South Korean President Syngman Rhee said Friday he does not believe—and never has believed—the truce talks at Panmunjom would end the war in Korea.

"I have never had any hope that they would result in peace," the 77-year-old president said at Seoul. "I do not have any hope now."

"Until the Soviet Union fully understands they cannot defeat the free nations, no peace is going to mean anything."

The Chinese Communist radio at Peiping seemed just as certain the armistice talks would fail, but for a different reason. The truce negotiations have been recessed, but will be resumed Monday.

Peiping charged the U. S. is calling recesses in the talks to "reck" the negotiations.

The Red radio accused the U.N. of violating "agreed principles" in calling the current recess.

2nd Major Contract Due at The Dalles
The Dalles — (U.P.) — The second major contract for construction of the \$350,000,000 The Dalles dam on the Columbia river will be opened to bidders August 21, Col. Thomas H. Lipscomb, Portland district army engineer, announced Friday.

These bids will be for construction of the 2370-foot concrete spillway, including tainter gates and excavation for the tail race and approach channel. The cost of the spillway section was estimated by Col. Lipscomb at more than \$15,000,000.
