That's the word from Brig. John Rockingham, Vancouver, who commanded the 25th in Korea until relieved this spring.

Rockingham said: "The troops are extremely well fed. Still, they miss those little tidbits they used to get at home, like canned chicken or any kind of seafood, especially crab or lobsters."

He said, "our troops get no fish in their rations and would appreciate fish food parcels to supplement their diet. They could also do with tea bags, dried soup packages, writing paper, ballpoint pens and pencils."

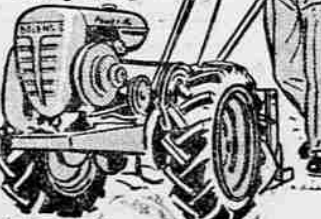
EX-ROGUES SEEN
