Jacksonville Lodge Appoints Committee; Plan Potluck Dinner

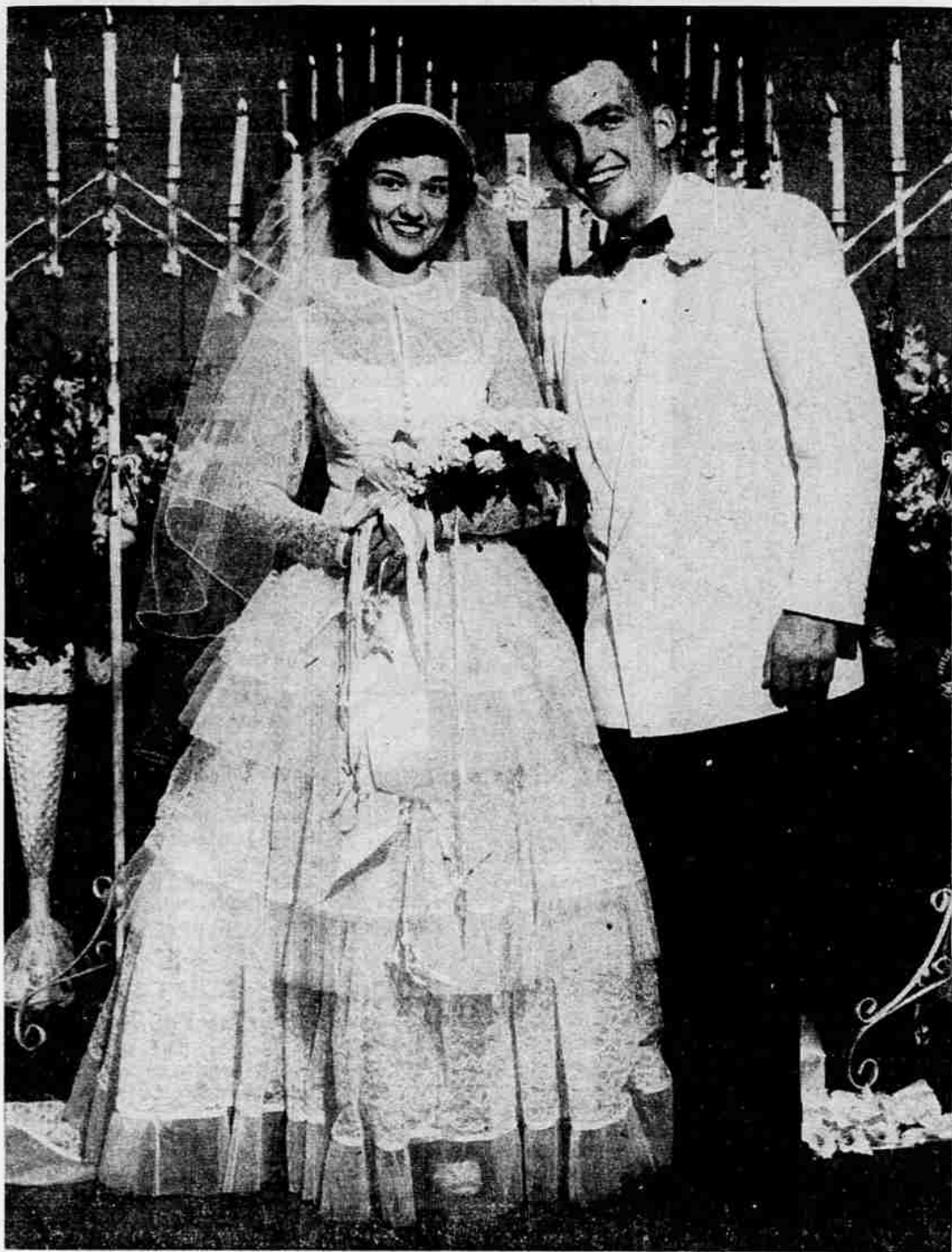
