

Defeat of McKellar Assures Realignment Of '53 Chairmanships

Washington — (U.P.) — The stinging defeat handed Sen. Kenneth D. McKellar makes inevitable a full-scale realignment of key Senate committee chairmanships next year—whether Democrats or Republicans win in November.

Not since the Republican 80th Congress met in January, 1947, will there have been such a major shakeup in vitally important committee posts.

The 83-year-old McKellar was pushed out of public office after 36 years in the Senate and six years in the House by 44-year-old Rep. Albert Gore, who learned a good deal of his government economics at the knee of elder statesman Bernard M. Baruch.

Powerful Leader
The flood of Tennessee votes counted Friday spun into defeat one of the most powerful men on Capitol Hill. McKellar headed

the Senate Appropriations Committee which passes on every nickel the federal government spends. To many, McKellar's word was virtually law. And he reigned as Senate president pro tempore as well.

The impending shakeup results from death, defeat, and retirement. It will be complete if Republicans take control of Congress this fall. It will be far-reaching even if the Democrats win.

Hayden May Succeed
McKellar, presuming a Democratic victory, will be succeeded by Sen. Carl Hayden, a man marked by his distaste for the limelight and one who has represented Arizona in Congress since the state was admitted to the union in 1912. In event of a Republican victory, the spending committee boss will be Sen. Styles Bridges of New Hampshire, who had the job in the stormy 80th Congress.

Another major change will be in the leadership of the foreign relations committee. Chairman Tom Connally of Texas is calling it a day and retiring after 24 years in the Senate and 12 years in the House.

If Republicans win control in the elections, Connally will be succeeded by Sen. Alexander Wiley of Wisconsin, a man who has eyed the post for years and who already is speaking out for the bipartisan foreign policy laid down by the late Sen. Arthur H. Vandenberg. The situation is not clear if the Democrats continue their majority.

Turnover Inevitable
A turnover of command is also inevitable in the youngest major committee of them all, the Senate-House Committee on Atomic Energy. Sen. Brien McMahon, (D-Conn.), the man who fathered the atomic control law, died recently. If Republicans take over, the chairman could be Sen. Bourke B. Hickenlooper of Iowa. But the House, which thus far has had to settle for the vice-chairmanship of the joint committee, may demand a turn. If Democrats hold tight to their Congressional control, Sen. Clinton P. Anderson of New Mexico or Rep. Carl T. Durham, North Carolina, are the best bets.

Eva Peron's Fortune Estimated in Millions

Montevideo, Uruguay — (U.P.) Mrs. Eva Peron left a fortune of more than \$20 million, well-informed Argentine political exiles estimated Saturday.

The late Argentine first lady's jewels alone were estimated to be worth at least \$15 million and in addition she possessed millions of dollars worth of cash, securities and real estate.

The exact value and disposition of her estate may never be known. Friends in Buenos Aires said she had left a will containing 86 bequests, but this has not been confirmed.

Bus Hits Two Poles When Driver Faints

Astoria — (U.P.) — An Oregon Motor Stages bus crashed into two utility poles, injuring one woman passenger, in downtown Astoria Saturday when the driver fainted.

The driver, Clark Richard Church, Portland, said he "passed out" while the bus was traveling along Taylor avenue on the way to a halt. The bus was badly torn.

The bus hit one utility pole, skidded 128 feet and crashed into a second pole before coming to rest on Seaside to Astoria road.

One of the seven passengers, Mrs. Irene Zimm of Warrenton, was struck in the face by glass splinters and was treated for minor cuts.

Lumber Prices Changed In Columbia District

Portland — (U.P.) — Four amendments to the Douglas Fir and Hemlock lumber price regulations and the setting of dollar-and-cent ceilings on refuse mill wood in the Columbia river district were announced Saturday by Carl C. Donagh, Portland district director of the Office of Price Stabilization.

The lids on refuse mill wood were \$4.35 per cord on fir and \$5.21½ on hemlock.

The Columbia river district includes Wahkiakum, Cowlitz, Clark, Skamania and Klickitat counties in southwestern Washington and Benton, Clackamas, Clatsop, Columbia, Hood River, Linn, Marion, Multnomah, Polk, Wasco, Washington and Yamhill counties in Oregon.

Eight Men Lose Lives in Two Eastern Air Crashes

Richmond, Va. — (U.P.) — Eight men died Friday in separate crashes of an Air Force bomber and a private plane flying through rain over Virginia.

The Air Force reported that a B-26 bomber on a routine three-hour training flight cracked up on Plum Tree Island, a Chesapeake Bay bombing range and that all four crew members died.

Private Plane Crashes
Earlier in the day, a Washington bound private plane groping through rain and fog rammed a Blue Ridge mountainside near Berryville, Va., and burned. Two oil company executives and two crewmen were killed.

The Air Force bomber, based at Langley Field, Va., had been aloft an hour and a half in a misty rain when the crash occurred. No cause has been determined. A spokesman said names of the crew of three officers and one enlisted man will be disclosed after notification of next-of-kin.

California Man Dead
Dead in the private plane crash were identified by the Clark County medical examiner as Cecil M. Finn, 52, Brentwood, Calif., personnel director

of the Superior Oil Co. and owner of the plane; Bascom Lang, 36, Midland, Tex., personnel director of another branch of the company; Eugene Tolman White, 35, North Hollywood, Calif., the pilot, and Oscar Earl Sivage, 35, also of North Hollywood.

Medford Sportsman Elected to Club

John Day, Medford rancher, was recently elected to membership in The Explorers club of New York, N. Y., an organization of world-wide explorers whose major aim is to encourage scientific research.

Membership in the club is limited to those making outstanding accomplishments in the field of exploration. Day qualified on the basis of his photography of wild animals in journeys from Peru in South America to Point Barrow, Alaska, two hemispheric extremes, and Scotland.

Also considered in his appointment was his work for the Old Oregon Trail association of which he is vice president. The Medford explorer and hunter is also a member of the Adventurers club whose headquarters is also in New York.

The only other Oregonians who are club members are Amos Burg, Portland, and Alexander Bojkov who is associated with the Oregon game commission laboratory at Clackamas.

Nagasaki Observes A-Bomb Anniversary

Nagasaki, Japan — (U.P.) — Saturday was the seventh anniversary of the atomic bombing of Nagasaki in which the lives of 70,000 persons were wiped out in a blinding flash.

A simple ceremony was held in commemoration of the day the second atomic bomb was dropped on Japan.

It was 11:02 a.m. Aug. 9, 1945 when the bomb was exploded on Nagasaki.

At 11:02 Saturday, church bells tolled and the citizens of the city bowed their heads in a minute of silent prayer for the dead.

National Soap Box Derby Slated To Get Under Way Today in Akron

Akron — (U.P.) — An entry list of 154 starry-eyed boys from all over the nation and from Alaska, Canada and Western Germany went through final preliminaries Saturday before the 15th running of the annual All-American Soap Box Derby here Sunday.

First round heat assignments have already been drawn, racers inspected and all was set for the

spectacle. An estimated 60,000 persons are expected at Derby Downs where the race has been run since 1935.

The 975.4 foot course, specially-built for the final race, was festooned with flags and bunting and lined with stands. The first prize for the Champ of Champions is a \$5,000, four-year college scholarship.

Fred Ross, 15, Juneau, Alaska, and Peter Kalinowsky, 14, from West Berlin, are the two entries farthest from home. The rest of the boys represent 148 Canadian and U.S. cities.

Political Action Leader Slate Talk

Portland — (U.P.) — A man widely blamed for preventing Vice President Alben W. Barkley from becoming the Democratic party's presidential candidate in November will be the headline speaker at the 16th annual convention of the International Woodworkers of America here September 15-19.

He is Jack Kroll, successor to the late Sidney Hillman as director of the CIO's political action committee and one of several labor leaders at the recent Democratic national convention who informed the 74-year-old "Veep" that despite his support of labor, he could not be supported by labor ahead of other liberal and younger men.

Labor spokesmen declared this was because Barkley was being advanced without his knowledge by a coalition of "Dixiecrats" and party machine men headed by James A. Farley.
