MAKE AT LEAST FLYING VISITS TO AGING PARENTS

When children grow up, marry, and go into homes of their own, the parents may find life very lonely. Every child, regardless of circumstances, owes his parents some consideration for the sacrifices they have made for him. That is what I have told the woman who wrote:

(Q) "I haven't visited my parents for five years. Before that, our visits would wind up unpleasantly because I didn't like the way my parents would run down my brothers and sisters. What love I ever felt for my parents has faded years ago. To me, it is unthinkable to visit just out of a sense of duty but my older sister is always writing 'honor thy father and mother' letters. What do you advise me to do?"

(A) As long as your parents are getting along in years, I think you should make a point of seeing them occasionally, if only for a day or part of a day. In that short time, they won't have any opportunity to pry into your affairs, to compare you with your brothers and sisters, to point out how you are superior to them or they to you, or any of the other unpleasantnesses you have tried to avoid.

When you make these flying visits, take at least one member of the family with you and make sure that the conversation is running along smoothly. Keep it as impersonal as possible to avoid their starting to criticize your brothers and sisters, or your friends.

Then, direct the conversation into pleasanter channels if they try to turn it into criticism of your brothers and sisters. Can Avoid Trouble
A great deal of your trouble with your parents can be avoided if you write them weekly letters and keep in touch with them by mail. In this way, they will have no reason to think that you are neglecting them but, at the same time, you will not be putting yourself in a position where they can make your contacts with them unpleasant. In your letters, you can ignore the questions

they ask you and which you do not want to answer. This will avoid any arguments with them and will still ease your conscience about your duty to them in their old age.

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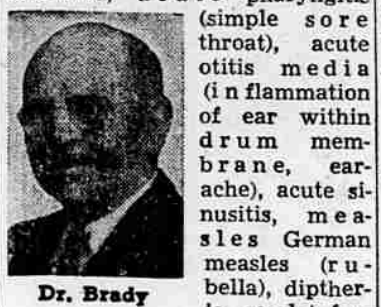
Your Health and Its Care

C-R-I SHORT FOR COMMON RESPIRATORY INFECTION

Pneumonia, acute bronchitis, pleurisy, acute laryngitis, acute tonsillitis, acute pharyngitis, acute sinusitis, acute otitis media (inflammation of ear within drum membrane, earache), acute sinusitis, measles German measles (rubella), diphtheria, scarlet fever, coryza (acute rhinitis, acute "catarrh" or, if you choose to be perverse, "cold in the head"), acute cerebro-spinal meningitis influenza ("grippe"), whooping cough, mumps, chickenpox, smallpox and poliomyelitis (infantile paralysis) usually spread from person to person by respiratory infection.

Respiratory infection means the germ or virus is carried in droplets of moisture, mucus or other secretion from nose or mouth of the person or persons who happen to be within range when the carrier coughs, sneezes or talks without covering face.

Some of these common respiratory infections may be transmitted in other ways, say by personal contact even though the carrier be careful, conscientious and properly masked. To the best of our present knowledge, however, the diseases named, with their complications and sequelae, account for three-fourths of all illness attended by physicians.

It is not a mere whim or theory of mine that respiratory infection is responsible for most of the illness in the community. If any reputable physician or health officer has any doubt about it he or she may obtain a report of the survey made by the U. S. Public Health Service.

Some old timers, within and without the profession, may re-

ject the idea that smallpox is a respiratory infection, but Boyd's Preventive Medicine says:
(a) Infective Agent—Unknown, but it is a filtrable virus.
(c) Exit of Infective Agent.—In the secretions of the mouth and nose and discharges from the lesions.
(d) Routes of Transmission.—By direct or indirect personal contact, and possibly by flies. The disease is probably most infective in the early stage, when lesions are present in the mouth, nose and throat.

Although smallpox is essentially a respiratory infection, the virus may be given off from the skin lesions or carried by flies. There is no reason to imagine that the virus of smallpox is carried from person to person by the air.

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and neither does the doctor, if you consult a doctor, whether it will prove to be a mild 48-hour coryza or measles or influenza or meningitis or poliomyelitis or diphtheria or tonsillitis. The local and general symptoms in the early hours of the illness are much the same in all the respiratory infections.

In the early hours, the stage of onset, the illness is most ineffective — much more likely to spread to persons near you than it is in the later stage. Therefore, if you are perverse and without conscience you may spread your infection with impunity before you become ill enough to take to your bed or before you or your doctor can

be reasonably sure just what you are distributing.
