ALL THAT SNIFFLES IS NOT CRI

Lest sophomores feel impelled to enlighten me about the common ailments of the better class, may I quote one of those long, long sentences for which a certain health columnist is notorious, from p. 8 of the booklet "Call it C-R-I, for which send 25c and stamped, self-addressed envelope:

A state hard to distinguish from ordinary infectious or communicable coryza may be caused by (a) hay fever; (b) hyperesthetic rhinitis or individual sensitivity to some foreign protein (akin to asthma in origin); (c) by effect of certain medicines in persons with idiosyncrasy, notably iodides; (d) mechanical variations in the general circulation from casual environment changes in persons subject to chronic lesions of upper respiratory tract such as chronic rhinitis, thickened or hypertrophied turbinates, chronic sinusitis.

A peculiarity of these non-communicable types of coryza is that the attack is abrupt in onset and it ceases just as abruptly. Such sudden spells of stuffiness of nasal passages, watery oozing or drip from the nose and perhaps excessive sneezing are commonly ascribed to drafts, insufficient heat, or insufficient clothing and the like. This misapprehension accounts for the difficulty of teaching such persons that drafts, sudden changes of temperature and the like have nothing to do with coryza.

Old timers with and without the medical profession may regard my teachings about the coryza (the Common Respiratory Infection) which cause three-fourths of the illness attended by physicians and surgeons—as the vagaries of a nut. But I find a good deal of mental as well as physical comfort and reassurance in my nutty notions about exposure to cold, dampness, drafts, insufficient clothing, sudden changes of temperature or temperature. 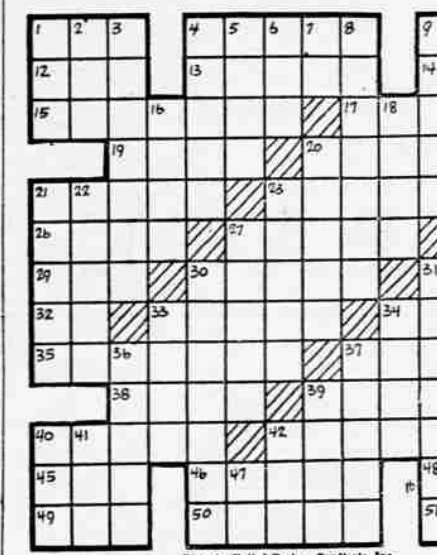
