Cast of 130 Slated To Participate in City Water Pageant

A cast of approximately 130 persons will take part in the second annual Medford Water Pageant, scheduled for Thursday and Friday nights at Hawthorne park, sponsors of the event stated Saturday.

The schedule of events includes musical numbers, dances, swimming and diving and several variety numbers.

Between 3,000 and 4,000 persons saw the first annual pageant, held last year, and plans are being completed to have facilities for larger crowds this year. Bleachers are being erected around the pool in addition to 100 permanent balcony seats.

Tickets for the performances can be obtained at the swimming pool office. There will be a charge for balcony seats and bleacher seats will be given without charge.

The pool will close Wednesday at 5 p.m. to allow time for final preparations for the pageant. It will remain closed all day on Thursday and Friday and will open at the regular hour on Saturday.

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Medford Navy Pilot Awarded Air Medal

Ens. Russell M. Killingsworth, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. Russell K. Killingsworth, Route 1, Medford, has been awarded the air medal for meritorious achievement in flights during operations from August 8 to October 17, 1950 in Korea, a navy release reported Saturday.

Ensign Killingsworth was released from active duty in October, 1951.

A pilot of a fighter plane in a squadron attached to the aircraft carrier USS Philippine Sea, Ensign Killingsworth carried out 10 attacks against enemy power plants, airfield installations, lines of communication, transport facilities, vehicles and shipping, the release states.
