

America To Stand, Baruch Declares At Dedication

Dyersville, Calif.—(U.P.)—Elder Statesman Bernard M. Baruch celebrated his 82nd birthday in the heart of a redwood forest thousands of years old Tuesday and said America will stand "indestructible till the end of time."

The silver-haired adviser to presidents said in a prepared statement beneath the world's tallest tree that in such a setting a man could be hopeful "that the dream of America—a dream of peace and plenty with equality of opportunity—will come true."

"No matter what dread attacks may come," he said, "America will stand, sheltering, inspiring, indestructible till the end of time."

Baruch addressed officials of the Redwood Empire association, Gov. Earl Warren of California and other dignitaries who had come to dedicate a redwood "birthplace" beneath the giant, 364-foot tree to the wistful park-bench philosopher.

A replica of a bench near the White House in Washington, the redwood bench symbolizes the many benches Baruch has sat upon during and between two world wars while pondering critical affairs of state.

Hewn From Redwood

It is hewn from another massive redwood taken from this 2000-year-old forest grove and bears the inscription:

"Dedicated to Bernard M. Baruch, philosopher, philanthropist, stalwart American . . . his stature is that of these redwoods."

Korea GI Education Bill Forms Available

Veterans with service anywhere in the world since the start of the Korean conflict, June 24, 1950, now may apply for education and training under the new Korean GI Bill, the Veterans Administration said today.

A limited number of application forms are available at all VA regional offices and bulk shipment of forms are being made this week.

The new Bill provides up to 36 months of training to veterans who were on active duty on or after the outbreak of fighting in Korea, regardless of where they served. While in training, these veterans may receive an allowance from the government to cover part of their expenses.

Petitions Circulated For Civil Employees

Salem — (U.P.) — Petitions were still being circulated in Salem Tuesday to put a collective bargaining measure on the November ballot, although the Civil Service Commission ruled that civil service employees may not legally circulate them.

Police and firemen sought to place both a collective bargaining measure and one for a 40-hour week on the ballot. They were warned last week that they faced suspension from their jobs if they continued to circulate the petitions themselves.

Stravinsky and Schoenberg Not Latest Words in Music

New York — (U.P.) — If you think that Stravinsky is modern and Schoenberg is the last word in music, you are considerably off the vanguard beam. Otherwise you would know that atonality is on its way out and percussionism cajoles the progressive ear.

Percussionism won official recognition in New York by the traditional supporter of artistic revolutions: the Junior Council of the Museum of Modern Art, headed by Mrs. John D. Rockefeller III.

The council presented this latest musical vanguard in a concert entitled "Music for Percussion"—a kind of free-for-all for xylophones, tympanies, trumpets, percussions, bongos and wood blocks. Among the works presented were a Suite for Tympani by Elliott Carter, "Ritmo Jondo" for percussion, clarinet, tympani, trumpet and hand-clappers by Carlos Surinach and a Sonata for Piano, Tympani, Xylophone and Percussion by Peggy Glanville-Hicks. To use the quip of an inveterate punster: "the percussion concert was a real hit."

"Who are the percussionists and what do they want?" Peggy Glanville-Hicks was asked after the hitting, smacking, banging and groaning was over.

"Our movement was initiated 20 years ago by Henry Cowell and Edgar Varese," said the young composer and music critic. "Paul Bowles, Lou Hargrass, John Cage, Colin McPhee and Alan Hovhanes are our other leaders."

The percussionists want to change music entirely, explained Mrs. Glanville-Hicks. Melody, already on the wane since the days of atonality, is completely disregarded. They consider harmony a "dated decorative device."

Their music consists of rhythm and nothing but rhythm.

The exclusion of melody and harmony is but part of the percussionist program. Another thing is the elimination of the tempered scale which has been the musical alphabet of western civilization for the last 300 years.

Anyhow Goes

The percussionists call the tempered scale an "aesthetic disaster" and declare that they don't want to be shackled by it. They intend to use any audible tone and not only those that can be produced on a conventional instrument. They have consequently replaced such traditional instruments as the violin and the cello by such musical newcomers as the siren, the road drill, the rice bowl and the brake drum. They use, of course, all
