

Stars Gain Tie for PCL No. 1 Spot

Hollywood, Calif. — (U.P.) — Hollywood's Stars moved into a tie for first place with Oakland Tuesday in the Pacific Coast league after winning a re-matched contest 8 to 3 over Sacramento.

The Stars, with Pitcher Johnny Lindall getting credit for the win, downed the Solons Monday night in a replay of a July 24 protected game. The other PCL clubs were idle.

Hollywood won the earlier contest 5 to 3 and Monday night's game started at the point of protest, in the bottom of the second inning with the score knotted at 1 to 1.

Lindall, who entered the tilt as a pinch hitter in the second inning, went on the mound to become the first pitcher this season in the PCL to rack up 20 victories. He has eight defeats.

Tuesday night, the Stars send Mel Queen (9-9) against San Diego's Bill Henry (5-3) on the Padre's diamond. Sacramento hosts San Francisco and will have Chet Johnson (8-12) against Elmer Singleton (12-13).

In other games, Portland enters Los Angeles and has Marino Pieretti (10-15) challenging Willie Ramsdell (1-2), while Seattle plays at Oakland with Vern Kindsfeather (16-10) facing George Bamberger (9-3).

Card Purchase Profits Denied

Washington — (U.P.) — Fred M. Saigh, president of the St. Louis National Baseball club, accuses Sen. John J. Williams of trying to make a "political football" out of his purchase of the Cardinals.

Williams, a persistent critic of the Internal Revenue Bureau, said in the Congressional Record July 4 he had been advised Saigh and the late Robert E. Hannegan made a "substantial profit" when they purchased the Cardinals for \$4,055,142. Williams intimated this profit accrued largely from failure of the Treasury Department to enforce strictly certain provisions of the Internal Revenue Code.

Saigh's reply to Williams was printed in the current issue of the Congressional Record by Rep. Melvin Price (D-Ill.)

Detroit Tiger Misfortune Regarded as Big Surprise

New York — (U.P.) — Detroit, once one of the fairest flowers in the American League, has certainly gone to seed this year. It appears consigned to the cellar for the first time in its history.

That such misfortune could befall Detroit is, surprising, indeed; for it is a very wealthy club and it has ranked for years with the New York Yankees as a top goal for ambitious players in the minors or majors. Then too, Briggs Stadium is perhaps the most attractive park in all baseball.

It is merely coincidental that the collapse of the Detroit Tigers is occurring in the same year that Owner-President Walter O. Briggs died and was succeeded by son "Spike."

Try Desperately

Spike Briggs and General Manager Charley Gehringer tried desperately to revive the supine Bengals; but nothing they did could overcome the collapse of the pitching staff and the injuries to second baseman Jerry Priddy and catcher Matt Batts. Even the dismissal of Manager Red Rolfe and his replacement by Freddie Hutchinson did not stimulate a renaissance.

Hutchinson, who gave up his relief-pitching duties to take the pilot's job, was at the new post less than 48 hours when Priddy suffered a broken leg while sliding into the plate in a game with the Browns. That blow staggered Hutchinson. Al Federoff was brought up to take over the second sack, but he hasn't yet proved himself a big-leaguer, particularly at the plate.

Flabbergasting

The disintegration of the Tigers' mound staff this year was truly flabbergasting, for it had been regarded as one of the strongest in the majors—despite a slight sluff-off last season when the club finished fifth.
