THIS IS A PROMISE

THAT SHOULD BE KEPT

When one makes a promise to the dying, should that promise be binding when conditions in one's life change? A man writes:

(Q) "When my wife's father was dying he asked her to promise that she would take care of her mother for the rest of her mother's life. My wife was a widow at that time with three small children and she lived with her parents. Since our marriage the mother has lived with us. She has a small pension but it is not enough to pay her expenses as she is an invalid. My wife and I are tied down and can't leave the house unless one of the children stays with the grandmother. My mother-in-law has two sons but they do nothing to relieve my wife and pay nothing for the mother's upkeep. Should my wife be bound by this promise to her father, even when conditions in her life have changed?

(A) A promise is a promise and should never be broken. When it is made to a dying per-

son, it is even more important. Your wife's parents gave her and her children a home when she was a widow and needed help. It certainly seems only right that your wife should show her gratitude now by making her mother's old age comfortable and happy.

Of course it seems a sacrifice to the whole family to have an invalid in the home. If your stepchildren are old enough to assume some of the responsibility of caring for their grandmother occasionally when you and your wife want to go out, they should feel this is their way of showing her gratitude for giving them a home when their father died. They should not begrudge her care and feel abused when asked to do things for her.

The financial side of the matter is another question. The sons should share the expenses involved in caring for their mother and not expect you to do everything. Put the matter up to them and ask them each to pay at least one-third of the costs. I am sure they will feel this is fair if you give their mother a home and care.

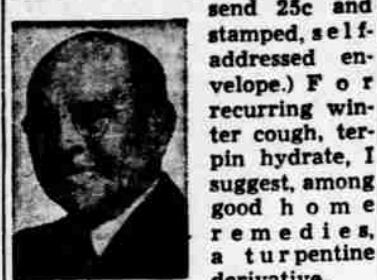

again I have warned against the liquid preparation called Elixir Terpin Hydrate with Codeine. Codeine is dope, an alkaloid of opium, and in my opinion codeine, like morphine and heroin (diacetyl-morphine), should never be used unless under the immediate attendance of the physician. Indeed, these narcotic drugs are not legally obtainable except by prescription.

It is conceivable that a doctor might in good faith prescribe a dose or two of a narcotic drug, with or without terpin hydrate or other medicine, in a case of chronic bronchitis, recurring winter cough, bronchiectasis or the like. But it is impossible to condone feeding such a patient a narcotic drug day after day and week after week in any circumstances.

An elixir is sweetened, aromatic liquid vehicle for other wise unpleasant medicines. Two teaspoonfuls of Elixir of Terpin Hydrate (N. F.) contain two grains of terpin hydrate—but don't confuse this with dope-laden Elixir of Terpin Hydrate and Codeine.

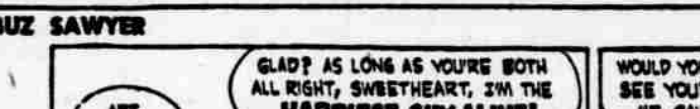
