

Neighbors Protest Negro's Occupancy Of Project Home

Chicago — (U.P.) — Order was maintained today at a federal housing project where unruly crowds had demonstrated in protest to a Negro family's occupancy of a project home.

About 10 per cent of the Chicago police department, or about 750 officers, were detailed to the area around the Trumbull Park housing project.

Crowds Assemble
Officers reported it was "all quiet last night and early today. Crowds up to 3,000 persons had assembled in the neighborhood every day since Sunday when the disturbance began.

They jeered, threw bricks, broke auto windows and attempted to harass policemen.

Donald Howard, 24, a postal worker, his wife and two children were the first Negroes to move into the previously all-white project.

'Should Reconcile Selves'
"The people of the neighborhood should reconcile themselves to our being here," Howard said.

Officers have made almost 50 arrests since Sunday, including one last night when a man was seen throwing a "stink" bomb on a street near the project.

CLYDE MORRIS SOUGHT

City police today requested that Clyde Morris, about 55, or anyone having information concerning him, contact the Medford police department or Jim Grigsby, Woodland, Calif., police department immediately. Grigsby is trying to get in touch with Morris, who is believed to be in the Medford area.

Attorneys Request Lobby Regulation

Sylvan Lake, S.D.—(U.P.)—The National Association of Attorneys General has asked the Council of State Governments to draft legislation for the regulation of lobbying.

The request was contained in one of 17 resolutions adopted at the end of the annual conference yesterday.

The association said "adequate" laws are needed to regulate lobbying activities.

Also adopted was a resolution pledging efforts to sustain the constitutionality of the submersed lands act. Montana, Rhode Island and Idaho voted against the resolution.

The association elected four board members. They included: Robert Smylie of Idaho.

Regional chairmen named included Edmund G. Brown of California.

University Receives Research Contract

Washington — (U.P.) — University of Oregon at Eugene has been awarded a \$12,500 unclassified physical research contract for atomic energy research, the Atomic Energy Commission said today.

The one-year contract was let as part of the AEC's policy of utilizing private research laboratories. It calls for "electric-chemical and polarographic studies on the corrosion of zirconium in the presence of various aqueous media."

The contract names Dr. P. Van Rysseberghe as investigator.
