New York—The Brooklyn Dodgers, picking on their favorite "whipping boys," pummeled Pittsburgh's Pathetic Pirates, 14-6, Saturday with an onslaught of four homers that gave the league leaders their 13th victory in 14 games with the tail-enders this season.

Carl Furillo paced the Dodgers' 15-hit attack, driving in four runs with a homer, a double and a pair of singles, while teammates Roy Campanella, Bobby Mearns and Al (Rube) Walker also homered in Brooklyn's seventh straight triumph.

Braves Win

The Dodgers, however, failed to increase their eight-game lead in the National League as second-place Milwaukee defeated Chicago, 2-0. Joe Adcock's 13th home run with Andy Pafo on base in the fourth inning gave southpaw Warren Spahn all the margin he needed for his 16th victory. Spahn allowed only five hits, two less than losing pitcher Bubba Church yielded.

Marv Grissom's steady six-hit pitching gave the Giants a 4-1 victory over the Phillies and snapped a six-game losing streak in the first game of the nightcap and then went on to win, 5-2.

Davey Williams' three-run double off southpaw Curt Simmons proved the key blow in the fourth inning of the opener. The Phils hopped on Larry Jansen in the first inning of the second game. Willie Jones hit a two-run homer in the ninth as Jim Konstanty, who relieved Steve Ridzik in the fifth, gained his 12th conquest.

Yanks, Chisox Lose
Loren Babe's double in the ninth inning scored Cass Michaels from first base and gave the Athletics a 9-8 victory over Yankees but the world champions retained their 6 1/2 game lead in the American League as Detroit nipped second-place Chicago, 5-4.

Dover, England—(U.P.)—Swimmer Florence Chadwick said Saturday she would "definitely" make a second attempt to swim the English channel both ways early Tuesday.

Miss Chadwick, who holds the women's record for both directions across the channel, attempted a round trip, non-stop swim last month but was hauled out of the water after becoming ill from exhaust fumes of her escort boat.

"It all depends on the weather," she said. "I'm ready for action and in fine shape."

She said she still is determined to make her "grand slam" of the European rough water swimming this year. She plans to swim the Dardanelles and the Straits of Gibraltar after the English channel.

Portland — (U.P.) — Coach Pete Susick of the State All-Stars was looking around Saturday for a replacement for Norman Hedgepeth of Grants Pass who suffered jaw fractures in scrimmage and will be lost to the Staters in their sixth annual Shrine high school football game here Aug. 22 against Portland All-Stars.

Examination Friday disclosed Hedgepeth had fractures of both jaws, apparently suffered in a recent practice session here. His loss was a severe blow to Susick who had planned to use the six-foot, one-inch end for heavy duty against the Portlanders.

Also sidelined was Marvin Vander Zander of Hillsboro. The husky tackle suffered a leg injury on the first day of practice and Susick was swatting word from doctors whether the Hillsboro star would be able to play.

In the Portland camp, Coach Harry Scarff of Central Catholic reported his players were in top condition and he planned a full scale scrimmage this afternoon.

Barbara Romack Fires Way To Canadian Golfing Title

London, Ont. — (U.P.) — Barbara Romack, a long-driving 19-year-old from Sacramento, Calif., won the Canadian Women's Open Golf championship Saturday by upsetting Marlene Stewart of Fonthill, Ont., 3 and 2, in the 36-hole final.

Miss Stewart, also 19 and the only Canadian ever to win the British Women's Amateur title, never was a head. Twice in earlier rounds she staged last-ditch rallies to remain in the tournament but Saturday the crowd of 4,000—largest in the history of the tournament and solidly partisan—failed to root the pint-sized Canadian to victory.

Neither teen-ager played championship golf but Miss Romack consistently outdrove Miss Stewart. The Canadian girl also was deserted by her usually deadly putter, three-putting twice on the first nine holes. Miss Romack was 1-up after the morning round. Battling the high wind and their own nerves, they played steadier golf after lunch.

Both parred the 25th and they birdied the 26th. But Miss Romack went in front to stay when Miss Stewart missed a five-foot putt and took a bogey on the 27th. The American girl made it 2-up by winning the 28th and held that margin until the end. They halved the next five holes and Miss Romack won when she took the 34th.

Both had five over par 82's for the first 18 holes.

Bridge Crosses Same River Three Times
Columbia, S. C. — (U.P.) — There's a bridge in South Carolina that crosses the same river three times.
At the point where the 1,250 foot bridge crosses Lynches river on U. S. Highway No. 1, at the Kershaw - Chesterfield county line, the river forms an "S". It crosses under the bridge in one direction, winds back under, and then completes the S to pass under a third time and continue in its original direction.



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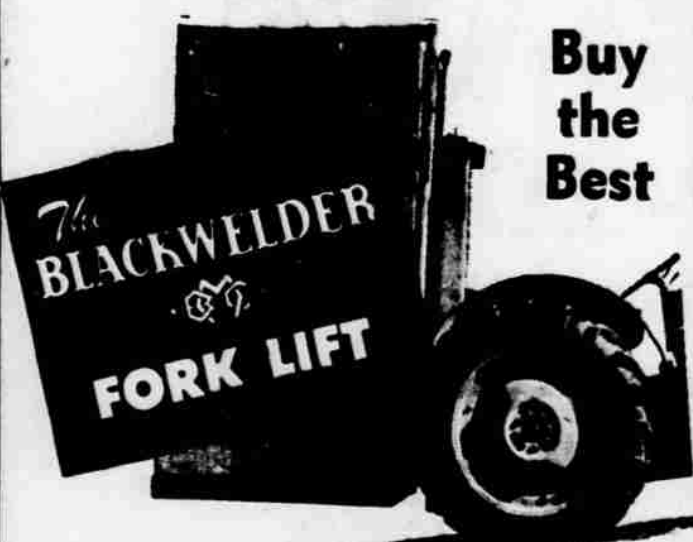
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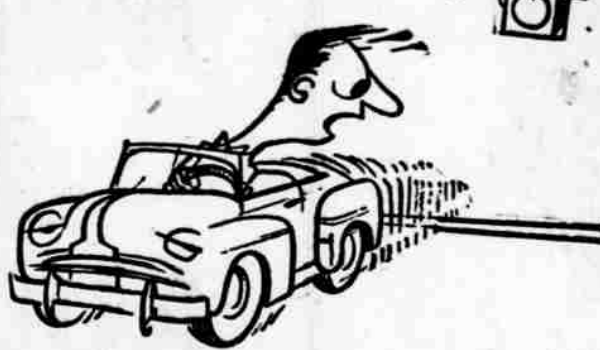
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
