Beavers Hammer 21 Hits To Bounce Rainiers 13-5

Seattle — (U.P.) — The Portland Beavers hammered 21 hits to submerge the Seattle Rainiers 13-5 in the opener of their eight-game Pacific Coast league baseball series last night.

Eight of the Beavers' hits, compiled off four Seattle hurlers were for extra bases. The Rainiers managed one threatening inning, the sixth, when they put together five singles and chased Royce Lint, Portland starter.

Lint, however, got credit for the victory — his 16th against 9 reverses.

Portland broke through for two runs off Bill Evans in the fourth.

Don Eggert led off with a triple to center and tallied on Eddie Basinski's double. Basinski moved up on an infield out and scored on a fly ball by Lint.
