Dr. Wells will return to Thailand next month where he is the head of Bangkok Christian hospital. Mr. Wilson was an outstanding administrator of relief in the city of Tsingtao, China, where more than 250,000 people were fed through the agencies that he headed.

Mr. Wilson will preach at the 11 a.m. worship. Radio station KYJC will broadcast this service.
