Thin American POW Gave His Companions Spirit To Resist Reds

Inchon, Korea—(U.P.)—A skinny little American POW martyrized himself and gave his fellow prisoners the spirit to resist Communism by defying the Reds on a parade ground.

"He rushed out there in front of everyone, when they fell us out for roll call," said Sgt. Lloyd W. Pate of Jacksonville, Fla., "and warned them that America would take revenge someday for what they were doing to us."

"Americans should know what happened that day. He was just a little kid starving to death and

sick, and he was down to skin and bones.

"I only have one thing to live for, and that is for the day Uncle Sam comes and frees us. After they come I am willing to die, but you can't kill me before they do."

Pate said the Chinese immediately seized the pain-wracked youth and rushed him into a small mud hut.

"We could hear him screaming all that night," Pate said. "The next day the Chinese said the rats had killed him."

Killed by Bullet

"I was on a burial detail up on the hill when they took him up and threw him in a hole, Pate said. "He had been eaten by rats all right."

"But right in the middle of his forehead was a bullet hole," Pate said the boy's bravery inspired his fellow American POWs to a new spirit.

"Right there and then most of us decided that Communism was something evil and that we had to fight it."

Plywood Pram Is Easy To Build

Building a boat of your own isn't as tough a project as you might think—provided you don't get your sights too high to start with.

And few do-it-at-home projects will pay you and your family bigger dividends in fun and relaxation during summer weekends or on your vacation.

One of the simplest crafts you can build is a 7' 9" pram. With it, three people can get out on the water for fishing or just drifting about. This little boat can be sculled with a single oar, rowed, paddled or driven by a light outboard.

Carries Three

Even when fully loaded with three people the pram has a comfortable margin of freeboard. It weighs only 60 pounds complete and you can carry it on the top of your car. Two of your children can lift it into the water. What's more it takes only two standard panels of 1/4" exterior fir plywood... the panels with waterproof glue... for sides, bottom and seats. The other materials consist of fittings and simple framing members; cost of materials is surprisingly small.

One Dead, Two Hurt In Mountain Feud

Fraser, Colo.—(U.P.)—One man was killed and two wounded yesterday in a blazing barroom gun battle in this Colorado mountain town, one of President Eisenhower's favorite vacation spots.

Charles Dunlap, 50, was being held under police guard in a hospital at nearby Kremmling, Colo., after a 53-year-old Fraser druggist, Ray Fox, was shot to death in the gunfight.

The dead man's brother, George Fox, 52, suffered gunshot wounds in the back and shoulder, while Dunlap also was wounded in the shoulder. Neither of the latter was in serious condition, authorities reported.

Sheriff Chancey Van Pelt, two-gun sheriff of Grand county who earlier this year shot to death two bandits after they had kidnapped him, said the shooting was the result of a long standing feud between the Fox brothers and Dunlap.

Two Stolen Vehicles Found, Police Say

Chicago Telephone Service Interrupted As Wage Drive Mounts

Long distance telephone service in Chicago was interrupted today and one picket was arrested at Kansas City as the CIO Communications Workers stepped up its drive to win wage boosts from the nation's telephone companies.

At St. Louis, federal conciliators called a meeting for Monday to try to end the strike by 53,000 CWA members against Southwestern Bell Telephone company in six states.

Picketing generally was peaceful against the Southwestern and Indiana Bell Telephone companies today except for a single incident at Kansas City.

At Chicago, 2,000 employees of the American Telephone and Telegraph Co. walked off their jobs "to attend a meeting" and virtually all long distance service was interrupted.

John J. Riley, 28-year-old picket, was arrested and released under \$100 bond at Kansas City after he allegedly threw two milk bottles against a telephone company building. Union officials said Riley acted on his own volition.

Violence subsided in the Indiana telephone strike where many exchange buildings have been under a state of virtual siege by pickets with windows smashed, gas bombs exploded and cables slashed.

Indiana union members, entering the second month of their strike, streamed through strike headquarters at Indianapolis where grocery and rent aid was distributed. Some ate at a "strike kitchen" set up by an Indianapolis

his packing house union local.

Union officials charged that state officers planned to call out the National Guard to use "bayonets on defenseless girl pickets."

Bomber Wreckage Scattered Over Square Mile Area

Tucson, Ariz.—(U.P.)—Wreckage scattered across the desert for "nearly a square mile" grimly depicted today how a giant B-50 Strategic Air Command bomber caught fire and crashed.

Two members of the plane's 12-man crew were killed and two others seriously injured yesterday when the bomber spun into the desert 40 miles north of here and exploded.

The remaining eight airmen escaped uninjured.

The 10 survivors all parachuted from the plane when an engine caught fire on a routine training flight from nearby Davis-Monthan Air Force Base to California.

It was the second B-50 crash in Arizona within the past month. Two B-50s collided in the air near Phoenix July 17.

One of those planes crashed, killing eight, while the other returned to Davis-Monthan with slight damage.

The two dead airmen were identified as Capt. Charles D. Bostick, 34, Marion, S. C., and S-Sgt. Herbert Pemberton, 28, Fort Scott, Kan.

Chicago—(U.P.)—Two Chicagoans say they have abolished dictionary drudgery. Chester Chesney, a steel company executive, and Mrs. Ella B. Wenger have patented a "talking dictionary." The machine works like a tape recorder. Put a card in it and it plays back the word, giving the correct pronunciation.

Bert Andrews, Newsman, Succumbs in Denver

Denver—(U.P.)—Bert Andrews, 52, chief of the Washington bureau of the New York Herald Tribune and a member of the board of directors of the paper, died at St. Joseph's hospital here early today.

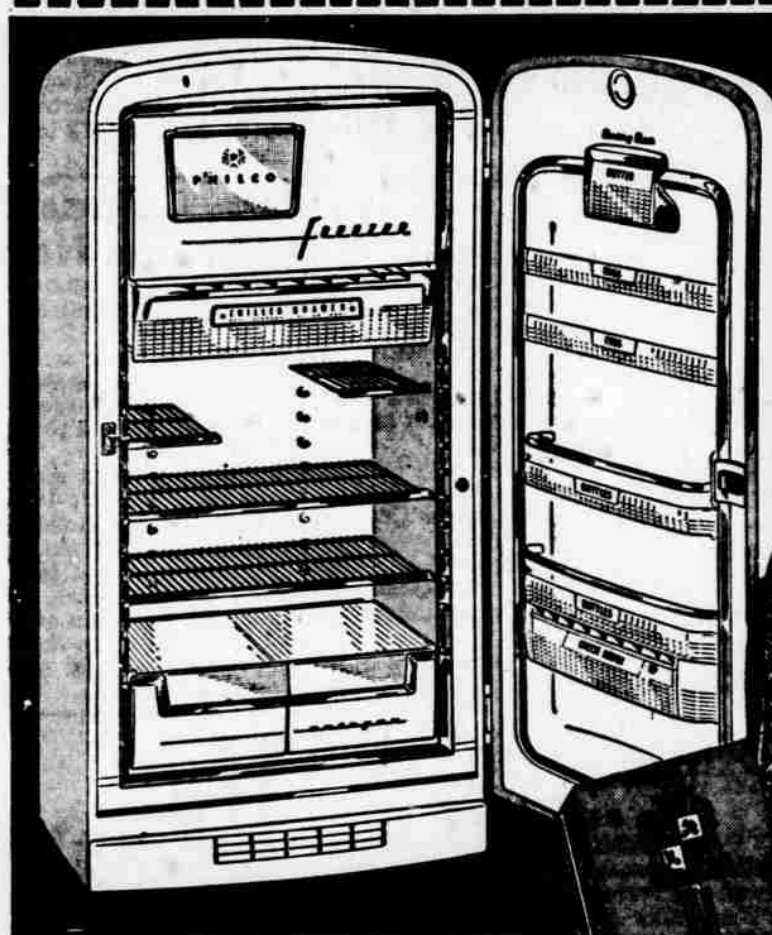
