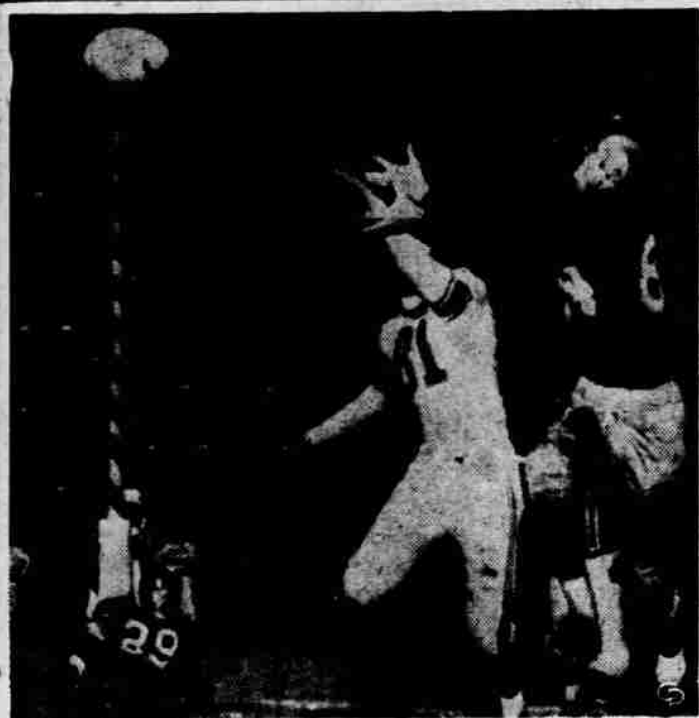

Dry Fly Fishing Reported Good in Union Creek Area

Portland — (U.P.) — Central and eastern Oregon offer the best trout fishing prospects while salmon fishing is good at Winchester Bay, the State Game Commission said today in its weekly report.

SOUTHWEST: Salmon fishing good at Winchester bay. Angling for spiny-ray and catfish good at Tahkenitch and Siltcoos lakes. Ten-mile lake perch and catfish angling good. Trout fishing improving. Bass fishing is very good at Loon lake and trout angling is fair.

Salmon fishing in lower Rogue is good and steelhead fishing has been fair offshore. Salmon fishing at Chetco Cove good; trout angling remains poor; good catches are being made on dry flies in the Union creek area and above.

Some large trout are being taken in the Illinois river on lures.

Lake Fishing Fair

Still-fishing in Fish lake in Jackson county fair with bait. Lake of the Woods fair to poor. Eastern brook angling in Bolan and Tannen lakes fair.

Catches of summer steelhead good on light-colored flies in the Steamboat area. Trout angling has improved between Cleveland rapids and Winchester. Most of the fish are caught on troll. Bait fishing for trout fair to good from Winchester to Glide and fair for fly fishing above Idleyd park.

Ann Arbor, Mich. — (U.P.) — Bob Prall of Salem, Ore., was six strokes off the pace today as the International Jaycee golf tournament here entered its third round.

Prall shot a 73 yesterday to go with a 78 the day before for a two-day total of 151. The leader was Johnny Pott, York, Pa., with a 145. Prall's 151 was good enough for a fifth-place tie.

The other two Oregonians, Roger Sielicki and Gary Hval of Portland, were far off the pace. Sielicki had a two-day score of 169 and Hval had 172.

Around Hollywood

Hollywood — (U.P.) — The chic pastime of sophisticated Americans who patronize only foreign movies is highly amusing to French star Victor Francen, himself a darling of the sub-title flicker set.

He says there's an equivalent group in his native country.

"There's a crowd of intelligentsia in Paris that just drools over American movies—some of them wouldn't be caught dead seeing a French-made film. It's all a little silly."

Hollywood Films Tops

Francen, who shortly will appear on Broadway in "On Earth as in Heaven," says there are good movies made everywhere and that Hollywood heads the list.

"The people who go crazy over French and Italian movies here are simply impressed because the players speak a foreign language and look so natural. It's an illusion. They can't understand the actors anyway, so the mistakes go unnoticed."

French hits such as "The Baker's Wife," "Grand Illusion" and "Beauty and the Beast" were excellent pictures, Francen explained, but actually no better than dozens of American films.

French Like Beery

"Not just Americans, but people everywhere, are attracted to

foreign things," he said. "You discover another world when you see a picture made in another land."

Francen said Americans would be amazed to know which Hollywood stars are the most popular abroad.

"Sophisticated movie fans in Paris were enchanted by Wallace Beery. And Beery was hardly considered a favorite of your smart set," he said.

Natural Actor

Frenchmen thought Beery was great because he was a natural actor. "They thought he played like an animal," Francen explained. "You see, the French are so used to intellectual things that when they see something of instinctive value, they consider it poetry."

The French, until recently, were great western fans. William S. Hart and Douglas Fairbanks, he continued, still are household words in France. He said Laurel and Hardy also are immortals on the Continent.

Blood Donation Appointments Now Being Taken

Anyone in good health between the ages of 18 and 60 can give blood when the bloodmobile comes to Medford next Wednesday, Red Cross officials reminded today. Those under 21 must have a signed release from their parents or guardians, unless they are married.

Appointments are now being solicited, and can be made by telephoning 3-3813.

The fact that the fighting has stopped in Korea has not decreased the need for blood. It only means that blood and its derivatives may now be used for urgent projects which could not be aided when military needs were higher. One of the major blood needs is for the production of gamma globulin, used to offer protection against the ravages of infantile paralysis.

Red Cross blood is also used in civilian hospitals, and in disaster needs.

Bad Check Reported By Oakdale Market

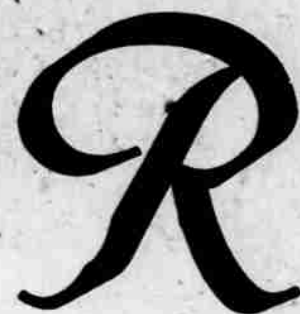
The Oakdale Market, 407 South Oakdale st., notified city police that it had accepted a fictitious check at 2:30 p. m. yesterday.
