"So I told them to drop into the Brown Derby and look. The same thing happened during the war when Charlie was a naval officer. When he came on board ship, word got around that he had been a big movie star, but none of the young sailors had ever heard of him.

However, after they had written home to Mom saying that Charlie Farrell was on board, Mom wrote back starry-eyed.

But that's all changed now. "Coming right into the living room of fans by television and radio makes a big difference," he says. "You sort of become a personal friend of millions of people."

Farrell is mobbed for autographs, people stop him on the street to chat as if he were a long lost cousin. But most important of all, he says, "nobody ever refers to me as "that silent film star."

Charlie needs a revived acting career like Notre Dame needs a new coach. As the owner of the Racquet Club in Palm Springs, he was leading a plush life, master-minding a million dollar a year enterprise and played as many sets of tennis as he pleased.

"But an actor's an actor for all that," he sighs. "Now I have to be up at six a.m. every day, work till dark, study lines for the next day and get ples tossed in my face. But make no mistake, I'm a ham and I love it!"

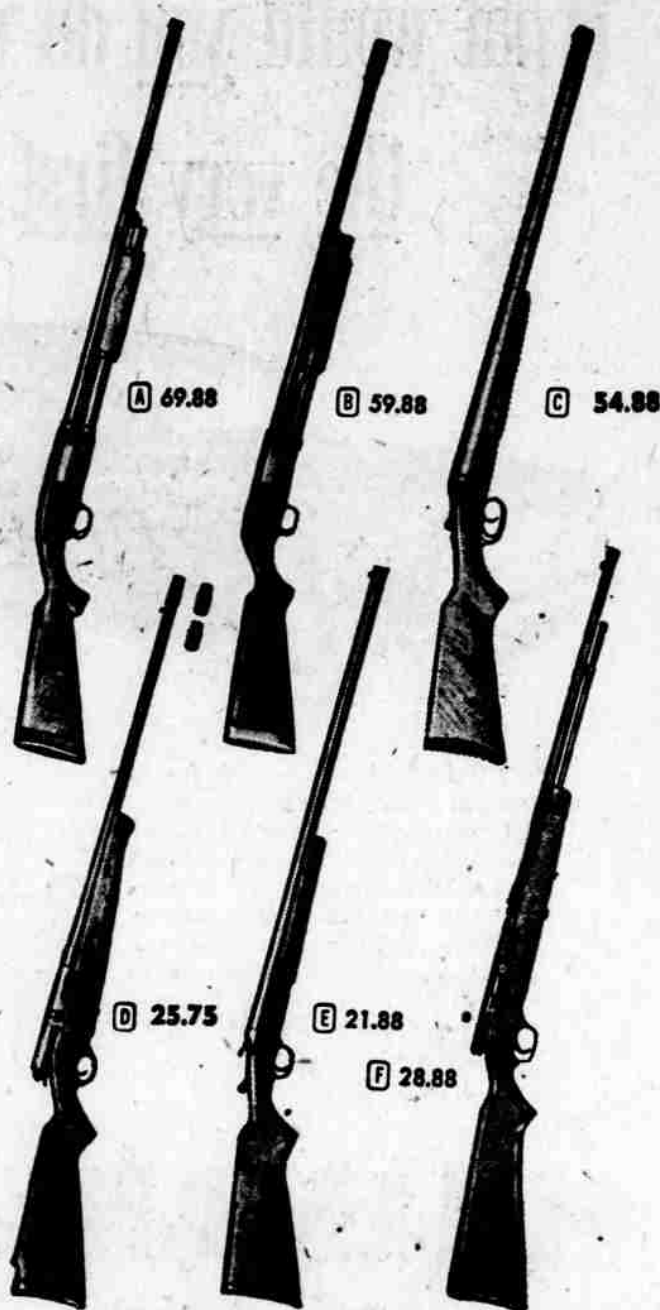
Smith was released from Santiam memorial hospital in Stayton yesterday, then brought to Salem pending the trial of Edmond Kizer who has been indicted by the Marion county grand jury on a charge of assault with a deadly weapon. Trial is set for Oct. 8 in Marion county Circuit Court. Kizer is being held in jail at Albany.

Also held as a material witness in the case is Cecilia Gindron who Sheriff Denver Young said was involved in the argument between the two men. She is held here.

Eugene Man's Body Found Near Coos Bay

Coos Bay—(U.P.)—The Coast Guard reported today the body of Roy Harley Gordineer, 24, Eugene, missing since August 9 in a boating mishap, has been found near North Coos jetty, about three miles north of here.

Gordineer was one of three men who drowned when their boat capsized on the Umpqua river while they were salmon fishing. Other victims, whose bodies were recovered a short time after the mishap, were William James Campbell, Wallowa, and Alfred Halvorsen, Cottage Grove.



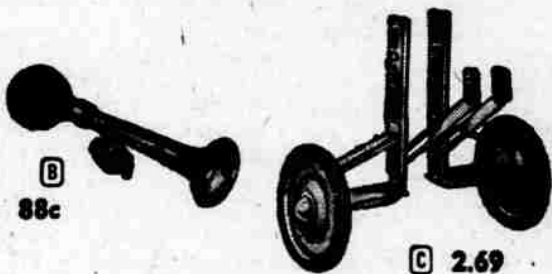
