

Two Sessions Set By Presbyterians For Church School

The church school of the First Presbyterian church has outgrown its present facilities, church officers state. In order to provide more personal instruction, and in order to leave room for continued growth, there will be two sessions of the school each Sunday beginning October 4th. Children of the Primary, Junior, Nursery and Kindergarten departments will have the choice of attending either the 9:45 or 11:00 a. m. sessions. Junior Hi and Senior departments continue to meet at 11:00. Children registering for the first time for the 11 a. m. session should meet this Sunday only in the Fellowship hall of the church between 10:45 and 11 a. m.

These sessions will run concurrent with the two worship services. Over-all direction will be given by General Superintendent, Mrs. George Planagan. James Johnston will superintend the 9:45 a. m. session.

There are 95 teachers and workers who will help and it is expected that the average attendance for the school will be over 600.

The curriculum for this year will highlight a study of "The Church" in all departments. This is an intensive study of the people and the movements which have made church history from its beginning to the present day.
