Washington — (U.P.) — Martin F. Smith, 63, a Justice Department attorney and former Democratic congressman from Washington, died last night at Suburban hospital in nearby Bethesda, Md., after a long illness.

Smith served in the House of Representatives from 1933 until 1943. He joined the Justice Department's anti-trust division in 1944.

Smith, a resident of Hoquiam, Wash., will be buried Thursday in Arlington National cemetery. He was a World War I veteran.

Molotov May Get Wish for Big 4 Talks But on West's Terms

It looks as if Soviet Foreign Minister Vyacheslav M. Molotov may get that Big Four conference he has been clamoring for — but not under the conditions nor at the time he desires.

Both Secretary of State John Foster Dulles and British Foreign Secretary Anthony Eden

intimated on Monday that the time for new West-East negotiations may not be far off.

But they made it plain, and Prime Minister Winston Churchill said flatly today, that the time for a conference will be after ratification of the Paris agreement for arming Western Germany and not before.

Soviet policy for months has been pointed toward preventing West German armament.

The Kremlin has proposed talks on German unification and an "all-European" security organization which would replace the North Atlantic Treaty Organization.

Against EDC Ratification First, the aim was to prevent ratification of the European Defense Community treaty which provided for arming of the Bonn Republic. France did refuse to ratify—for its own reasons, not to oblige the Kremlin—and that pact was killed.

The Western allies started work at once on a new and even stronger agreement, and their new Western European union treaty was signed in Paris last Saturday.

On the same day, Molotov sent notes to the United States, Britain and France proposing a Big Four conference in November on withdrawal of foreign troops from Germany, unification of East and West Germany and the Moscow-style "all-European" security organization.

The motive was transparent—Molotov is now trying to prevent ratification of the Western European union agreement.

Allies Don't Bite The allies had foreseen the move and did not take the bait. Eden said in the British House of Commons Monday, in discussing the Paris agreement:

"If we can bring about stability and a common purpose in the West we shall have established the essential basis on which we can seek an understanding with the East."

A few hours later Dulles, speaking at the televised cabinet meeting in the White House, said:

"When we create . . . a position of solidarity and strength for Western Europe, then there may be a new basis for discussion which doesn't exist at the present time."

West German Chancellor Konrad Adenauer, who would be consulted at every step in any plan for a Big Four conference, said Monday in a cabled interview with Hugh Baillie, president of the United Press:

"After the agreements concluded at Paris go into effect, the prospects that Russia will agree to give up East Germany will improve because it has been proved that Russia will only make concessions if the West is united and strong."

Thus the allies seem to look forward, before long, to agreeing to meet Molotov. But they will do it only after the Western Union treaty has been ratified. Molotov will not be pleased.

HB 661 — Coming on for repassage (after consideration in the House). On repassage of bill the vote was: Yes 29; No 0; Absent 1 (Musa). Bill repassed and title of bill stood as title of act.

Both times that HB 661 came to a vote in the Senate, Senate Richard L. Neuberger voted for passage of HB 661!
