More Popcorn Fun

For Halloween Parties

For Halloween or for children's parties anytime of year, make Snow Men by making popcorn balls sized for head and body, use raisins for the eyes, nose, mouth and front buttons. Top with folded hat in colored paper. Any child knows how to make paper hats if you don't happen to remember.

Carnival Corn

Big party specialty; easy to make. Combine one-half cup sugar; two-thirds cup light molasses, one-third cup water, one tablespoon vinegar, one-fourth teaspoon salt; stir until sugar dissolves. Cook to light crack stage (270 degrees, if you've a thermometer). Remove from heat; add one tablespoon butter and one-eighth teaspoon soda. Stir well. Pour over eight cups popped corn and two cups shelled peanuts. Toss well.

Harvard Beets Favorite

This is perhaps the most popular of all recipes for serving beets as a vegetable. A reminder if you haven't fixed them lately. Melt two tablespoons butter; add one tablespoon cornstarch, one tablespoon sugar and one-fourth teaspoon salt. Blend. Add one-half cup vinegar and cook until thick. Add two cups cubed cooked beets and heat thoroughly. Six servings for four persons.

For a change substitute two

tablespoons sugar for the one medium orange; juice and rind of one medium orange for the one-half cup vinegar.

Curry Powder Biscuits

For an interesting flavor base, try curried biscuits for any of the blander creamed dishes such as eggs, tuna, chicken and the like. About one-half teaspoon of the curry powder sifted in with the dry ingredients for a two-cups-of-four recipe is a good start. If your family likes stronger flavors than most, add more curry powder.

Plentiful Peppers

Enjoy more often plentiful peppers from nearby farms. To get the full benefits of the excellent nutritive value of peppers, they should be eaten raw and this is no hardship for peppers are one of our most popular salad ingredients. Children enjoy green pepper rings or slivers along with their raw carrots and celery. Peppers also make a very tasty dish when stuffed with a meat or fish mixture and baked with a cheese topping.
