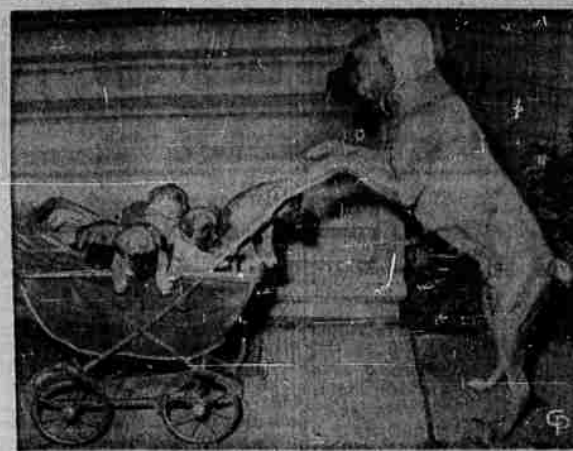
Circle Members Sew For Coming Bazaar
