Military Censorship, Started in Korea in 1950, Brought To End

Seoul, Korea—(U.P.)—Military censorship ended in Korea today because of the steady drop of news volume and the decline in security considerations. Joint field press censorship offices in Tokyo and Seoul which had handled millions of words filed by correspondents covering

the war and armistice immediately went out of business.

An announcement in Washington by Defense Secretary Charles E. Wilson ended a Korean institution that began Dec. 23, 1950, six months after the Korean war started.

Last dispatch to go through censorship was filed by Sgt. Robert L. Brown of the Pacific Stars and Stripes. Brown's dispatch reported a press conference given by Gen. Maxwell D. Taylor, 8th Army commander. Gen. John E. Hull, supreme United Nations commander in the Far East, thanked censors and correspondents for their aid and understanding during censorship.

"Censorship, although alien to the jealously guarded American principles of freedom of speech, is necessary in time of war and was necessary during the Korean conflict and the following months of uneasy truce," Hull said.

Form Changed Twice
Korean censorship first was suggested by the correspondents themselves. It has changed twice in form since its beginning.

The first change occurred early in 1951 when the 8th Army formed the Press Advisory Division. The Air Force and Navy followed suit.

When better organization was needed, the Joint Field Press Censorship Group (JFPCG)—including Army, Navy and Air Force officers—was organized in January, 1953, under the command of Col. James T. Sheridan.

No Clues in Jewel Theft at Las Vegas

Las Vegas, Nev. — (U.P.) — Sheriff's deputies reported no clues today in their search for a burglar who stole \$56,265 in jewels from the hotel room of Max Factor Jr., noted Hollywood cosmetics manufacturer.

The theft occurred Sunday while Factor and his wife, Mille, were staying at the Flamingo hotel, but deputies withheld disclosure of the burglary until last night because they believed it had been "an inside job."

Factor said some of the missing gems were birthday presents to his wife. Included in the loot was a nine-carat diamond ring valued at \$18,000 and a man's diamond ring valued at \$4500.

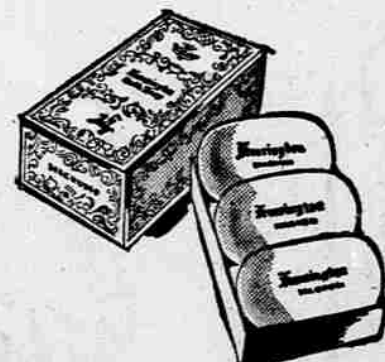
