Important Vase Discovery Made

St. Louis—(U.P.)—Dr. George E. Mylonas, professor of art and archaeology at Washington University, has reported discovering "the most important vase ever found on Greek soil."

Mylonas, head of a university archaeological expedition to Greece, reported the discovery in a letter to university officials. He said it was found in an excavation project at Eleusis, 14 miles west of Athens.

He reported the vase as about four and a half feet high and covered with paintings of unusual brilliancy. The paintings tell the story of the blinding of the Cyclop Polyphemus by Ulysses and the story of Perseus and the Gorgons.

The jar was broken when found, but its pieces were still lying together, Mylonas said. After cleaning in a special solvent, the pieces were placed together and the paintings could be seen.

The vase was found in the ancient cemetery of Eleusis where Mylonas and his crew have explored 30 graves ranging in date from 1800 B. C. to 300 A. D.

Mylonas said the vase dates from the year 650 B. C. There

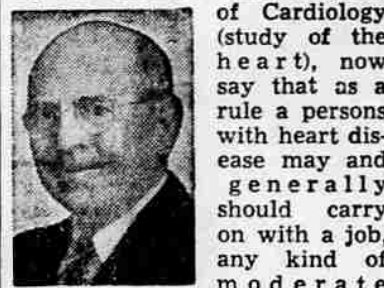

THE POOR GEEK WHO WALKS ON EGGS

Scientists, according to Uncle Pete, medical scientists, attending the second World Congress of Cardiology

work, that is, not extremely heavy labor. A doctor becomes a scientist automatically, in Uncle Pete's language, by attending such a medical society meeting far from home.

These scientists-for-a-day don't stop there. No, by golly, they say that patients with heart trouble generally feel better for doing a day's work, and patients who avoid daily work because of heart trouble may be injured by taking it easy.

This may be new to a lot of old fossils in the profession and

to a good many persons who use "weak heart" as an excuse for avoiding work.

In the "C V D" book (about heart and artery trouble) I explain the importance of exercise in the treatment of heart disease, graduated exercise, which, in my judgment, is second only to B-Nutrin as a remedial measure. For a copy of "C V D" send 25c and stamped, self-addressed envelope.

Drs. Master, Dack and Jaffe reported in "American Heart Journal" that in 890 cases of coronary occlusion the circumstances preceding onset of symptoms were sleep 22%, rest 31%, mild activity 20%, moderate activity 8%, walking 15%, and unusual exertion 2%.

Conclusions of Drs. Levine and Lown, reporting in J.A.M.A. their experience with the "armchair" treatment of acute coronary thrombosis:

Strict rest in bed is injurious; sitting position in arm chair obviates some of the harm of strict bed rest.

The prompt improvement shown after patients desperately ill with congestive heart failure were placed in a chair was particularly impressive.

Beginning not later than the first week of the attack, 81 patients were kept in a chair varying and increasing position.

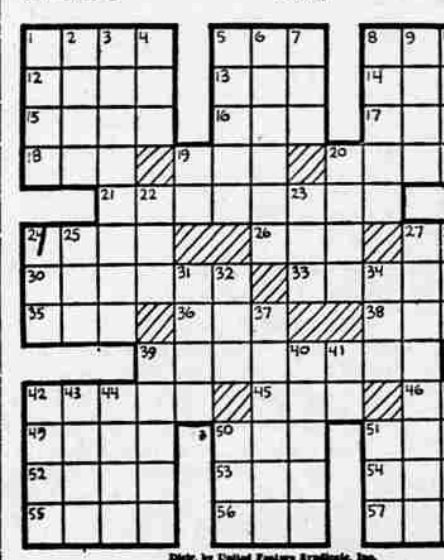

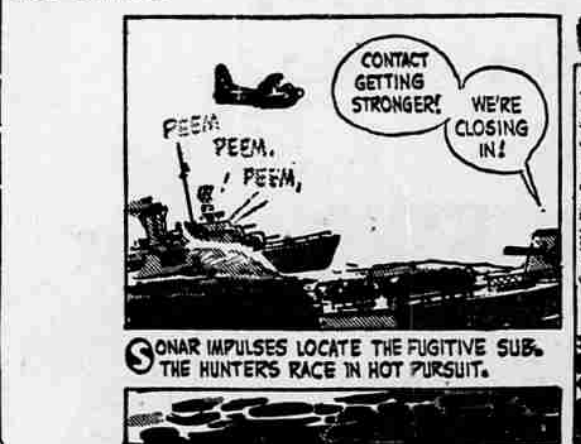

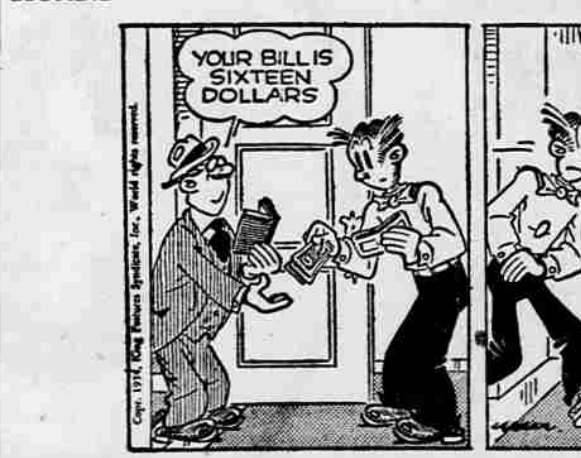
