Your Health and Its Care

WANE OF A CRAZE

From correspondence with readers it appears some people choose to think the w. k. horse and buggy doc who runs this racket brands tonsil operations as unnecessary and unwarranted.

I believe and teach that tonsillectomy is unnecessary and unwarranted, except perhaps in rare instances of malignancy. This attempt to "get every bit of tonsil tissue" is based on ignorance of pathology, particularly on the erroneous assumption that small round-cell, adenoid, lymphoid tissue, of which the tonsils and adenoids are composed, is in itself harmful to the body.

If any physician or surgeon of standing wishes to refute this or any other assertion of mine, I promise to print his or her statement, within space limitations imposed upon me here, and to reveal or withhold the writer's identity, as he or she prefers.

In many pieces dealing with the tonsil question I have pleaded for simple old-fashioned tonsillectomy, which is a minor operation, to be sure, but far safer than, and at least as effective as the major operation (tonsillectomy) for children with enlarged (hypertrophic) tonsils.

Authoritative medical textbooks of the present era scarcely mention such a quaint operation as tonsillectomy. In fact, I had to go back to 1904 to find it recommended as treatment of enlarged tonsil, in the 3rd edition of Kyle's "Diseases of the Nose and Throat" (W. B. Saunders Co.).

Kyle's textbook mentioned tonsillectomy (with the tonsillotomy, by the way, is the instrument which was used to clip or slice off the obstructing

portion of tonsil, before the medical profession went berserk on the removal of teeth and tonsils. The principle, not just a the-

ory, of focal infection was introduced to American medicine by Drs. Edward C. Rosenow and Frank Billings in 1910-1914. Despite the subsequent craze for removing tonsils and teeth on the bare assumption that they harbored or might one day harbor infection, the principle is firmly established in practice.

In an authoritative textbook published in 1922—Holt and Holland's "Diseases of Infancy and Childhood" (Appleton)—appears this typical statement:

"In any case of chronic sepsis (septicemia, blood poisoning) of obscure origin the tonsils should be suspected and removed if any doubt exists."

It didn't require much to raise such doubt in the mind of the doctor when the tonsillectomy craze was raging.

In England and in the United States there has been a decrease in the number of tonsil operations in the past fifteen or twenty years. In the United States there are still too many tonsillectomies, in my opinion. Here in Yankeland, that is, where it is still possible for a good salesman to "perform" tonsillectomy wholesale and get the victims' picture in the paper besides.
